



EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD GOSPEL MEDITATION

Outside Chicago, there is a small cemetery in the woods behind Mundelein Seminary, where I was a student. One night I was exploring it. I looked up and was shocked to see an imposing seventeen-foot angel towering over me and preparing to blow a trumpet. Adrenaline rushed through me. I gasped and uttered, "Oh my God!" Quickly I realized it was in fact a massive bronze statue. I tried to calm myself down. But it still freaked me out.

As we begin to celebrate Easter today, this image might seem a bit unnerving. But please recall that for the first disciples on the morning of the resurrection, it was precisely that. It wasn't joyful at first, it was terrifying. It wasn't peaceful, it was unsettling. In that Jerusalem cemetery, something otherworldly had happened. Angels announced that he was no longer dead but alive. They had blown their trumpets, so to speak, and Jesus had risen. Soon the disciples' shock in that dark cemetery would turn into joy.

We all have our own places of the dead, too, don't we? Deceased loved ones. Our tired patterns of blame. Relationships stuck in resentment. Indifference to the poor. Lost dreams. Despair about our future. Fear of sickness and death. These are our "cemeteries" where we don't expect much to happen. Today we enter — if we dare — those places with the disciples. See the mighty angel standing there, trumpet ready to blare!

EASTER & EASTER SEASON MARCH 31ST

He is Risen! Alleluia!!!

We have journeyed together through the forty days of Lent. We have worn purple, prayed, fasted, and given alms as we focused our hearts ever more keenly on Christ. Our music and our lives have been more sparing as we prepared our hearts for the great celebration of the Triduum and Easter Sunday.

The Easter Vigil, day three of the Triduum, is on Saturday, March 30 at 8:00pm. We then celebrate our regular schedule of Sunday morning Masses on Easter Sunday. At 7:00 am, we have cantors and a string quartet. At 9:00 am, we have the Bell Choir. At 11:00 am, we have the Adult Choir and a Brass Quartet. There is no 6:00 pm Mass on Easter Sunday. In order to help us celebrate lavishly and well, incense will be used at the Easter Vigil and on Easter Sunday at the 9:00 am and 11:00 am Masses.

Of note this year is that we will be welcoming many new members into the church who have participated in Becoming Fully Catholic with Father Ariel. At the Easter Vigil, we have the honor of welcoming Catechumens, who will receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. On Easter Sunday morning, Candidates will be confirmed in the Catholic faith.

Easter Sunday is the start of the Easter Season, which lasts for fifty days, culminating in the Feast of Pentecost. During the Easter Season, the entire character of our worship changes. Our music becomes brighter and more jubilant. We can proclaim once again the joyous refrain of "Alleluia." "Alleluia" comes from the ancient Hebrew meaning, "Praise the Lord!" It is used in the Mass as a superlative expression of thanksgiving, joy, and triumph since Christ has conquered death. We sing "Jesus Christ is Risen Today" with its chorus of Alleluias. We proclaim the Gospel Acclamation, which uses Alleluia as the refrain and then a verse that summarizes the main idea of the upcoming Gospel reading. Lastly, we are dismissed at the end of the Mass with the priest or deacon chanting: "Go in the peace of Christ, Alleluia, Alleluia!" To which we respond, "Thanks be to God, Alleluia, Alleluia!" This ancient chant ties us to our rich tradition and history as Catholics and reminds us every week of Christ's resurrection and triumph over death. He is risen: Alleluia!



TESTIMONIAL BY PARISHIONER LAURA LIEN

Prior to going on this mission to the Dominican Republic last Fall, I was a little nervous to be honest. I had never been on a mission trip before and never saw poverty face-to-face. We all think we know what poverty looks like since we have seen the lives of the poor on TV, in magazines and videos, so I thought I was prepared. Visiting the communities and villages of the people of the La Sagrada Familia Community was eye-opening to say the least.

Visiting the nutrition centers was different than I was expecting. This was basically a daycare setting with the main purpose of providing a warm breakfast and lunch to preschool-aged children five days each week. They seemed to be having fun with their peers and teachers, engaging in some basic learning and singing. Looking into the eyes of these children not knowing what they were going home to and wondering if this may be the only meal these children get all week long—it was heartbreaking!

The people of this community were so full of love, kindness, and goodness, regardless of their lack of "things." Their love of the Lord and willingness to share that with us was heartwarming. They may be poor in material things but are rich in spirit and their faith in God.

As Catholics, we are called to help, serve and provide for those in need, like our Dominican Republic family. Please consider La Sagrada Familia this Lent as your almsgiving. It truly is the gift that keeps on giving!




