

THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT LUKE 4:1-13

One of the most fascinating moments in American history is when George Washington could have become the king of the newly liberated United States and didn't. At the height of his power and fame, on Dec. 23, 1783, he resigned his commission as Commander-in-Chief and went home. The astonished King of England remarked that in doing so, Washington was "the greatest man in the world." Greatness is often defined by what we could do but don't. Greatness is measured by the temptations we overcome.

Jesus' greatness is revealed in his victory over temptations, too. The three offered him by the devil contain, we might say, all potential possible temptations: food, power and fame. They correspond to the triple human needs of body, soul and spirit. In overcoming these three, he says "no" in essence to every and even the greatest temptation. We see that every desire of his humanity — body, soul and spirit — is perfectly united to God, to love. This is a power available to each member of his body. It is the path to true greatness. How can we, who so easily fall into even small temptations, find the power to overcome large ones? By entering into the great dynamics of Jesus' temptations.

Lenten challenge: This first week of Lent, list some concrete ways you can overcome temptations that correspond with your desires. For example, you may give up snacks between meals, choose not to participate in an activity of which you are an expert, and decide to reduce social media posting by 50%. It may not seem like much, but by saying "no" to the tyranny of food, power, and fame (in this example), you'll discover true greatness.


Reflection questions for Sunday, March 16th

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Mini Reflection: The devil knows that Jesus is human, so he uses all the best tricks he has for getting humans to break. The devil will try these things with us, too — this Lent and throughout our lives. But how can we resist? We're only human. What do we have that the devil doesn't have?

What the Devil Doesn't Have

The devil knows all the rules. The devil knows all the Bible verses. He probably knows them better than you do (certainly better than I do). He knows them so well that here, in today's Gospel, he thinks he can outsmart the Son of God. He thinks he can out-argue him.

See, the thing you need to know about the devil is that he could have a master's degree in theology. Maybe even a doctorate. But have you ever met a master's student, or even a doctoral one, who doesn't have a particular passion for what they're studying? I sure have.

The devil didn't rebel against God because he didn't understand God's will. He rebelled because he understood God's will perfectly — and he didn't like it.

The devil knows that Jesus is human, and so in today's Gospel he employs all the very best tricks he has for getting humans to break. Physical hunger. Insecurity and a desire for power. The yearning to appear learned and wise.

The devil will try these things with us, too — this Lent and throughout our lives.

It doesn't work with Jesus because, of course, Jesus is not just human. He can feel temptation, but he will not submit to it. But how are we supposed to do the same? We're not divine. We're just human.

Well, here's the thing. We may be only human, but as Christians, we have a secret weapon. (No, it's not a master's degree in theology. Some of you may have that, but it probably doesn't make you holier.)

We have a love of what the devil has renounced — those things belonging solely to God. Truth. Joy. Humility. Sanctifying sacrifice.

Let the love of those things carry you through this Lent and beyond.

ALMSGIVING: AN EXPRESSION OF GRATITUDE

When we look at the three traditional "disciplines" of Lent, prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we know that almsgiving gets the least attention. Yet, the Bible places emphasis firmly on almsgiving:

Prayer and fasting are good, but better than either is almsgiving accompanied by righteousness ... It is better to give alms than to store up gold; for almsgiving saves one from death and expiates every sin. Those who regularly give alms shall enjoy a full life (Tobit 12:8-9).

Almsgiving is simply an expression of our gratitude for all that God has given us and a realization that as a member of a community of faith, it is never just about "me and God." It is fundamental to being a good steward of our community. For disciples of the Lord, almsgiving means much more than simply throwing a little change in the poor box. It is an attitude of generosity. It challenges us to examine how we are using our time, abilities, and money to better the lives of those around us. It urges us to share what we have been given by God with others in love and justice. It reminds us that Jesus blesses those who seek to be "poor in spirit" (Matt. 5:3).


Almsgiving opens our hearts to the realization that God blesses us through those we serve. It is here that we find the great mystery of Christian service. We see God in the life of Jesus, and we see Jesus in all those who are in need of our care. Look around, see those who are in need, and ask God to take away those obstacles and distractions that keep us from being generous with them. In turn, we will receive God's blessing.

Consider one or more of these creative almsgiving ideas for the remainder of this Lenten season:

- Show an act of kindness to someone you don't speak to often.
- Visit an elderly person who may be lonely.
- Reflect on the regular contributions you make to the parish.
 Could you do more?
- Perform an extra chore for your parents one day each week during Lent.
- Go through your closet and find some clothes in good shape to give away to other children who are in need of clothes.
- Write a letter or create a card for someone who is sick or might be lonely.
- Buy some cans of food to give to a local food bank or soup kitchen.
- Donate diapers, formula, baby clothing, baby furniture or maternity clothing to a local crisis pregnancy center.

I was quite nervous to go on this trip. No AC - I'm going to melt. Building houses - I could barely feel my arm from a pinched nerve. I spent the months leading up to the trip praying and honestly talking myself out of it.


Well, God had other plans. As the weeks leading up to the departure grew closer, I was considering neck surgery for that pinched nerve. But through prayer and a little chiropractic work, the pain and numbness resolved just weeks before departure. One excuse gone. Then, the date for the trip was moved back to mid-November, so the temperatures wouldn't be so bad. I could handle that.

God had cleared the first two major hurdles that prevented my yes, so... here goes it. As I was meeting with a group of complete strangers that I would be traveling to a foreign country with, I wondered, how am I going to get through this week? The answer became clear for me: just say yes.

Throughout our week in the Dominican Republic, I witnessed so many miracles. I was impressed by the strength God gave our group as we moved pallets full of cinder blocks and mixed concrete by hand in the hot sun. The love and generosity of the people was so humbling. They invited us into their homes for a bit of shade when we were overheating. They brought their furniture out onto the shady front porch for us to sit and rest on breaks.

We had an opportunity to go to the nutrition center where your alms are being used to provide necessary protein, fruit and vegetables. Prior to this support they were only provided rice and beans twice a day. Likely the only food they would have each day. I thought we were there to feed these children, but their joy fed us. As we interacted with the children and experienced their love, I was moved to the depths of my heart.

Each moment we served the people of La Sagrada Familia, we received tenfold in love, gratitude, and grace.






