



THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

3RD SUNDAY OF LENT JOHN 4:5-42

My childhood best friend was Xander Price. He was the fastest runner in school, an excellent baseball player, and Jewish. Though his family wasn't intensely religious, I felt totally at home with them despite our religious differences. Everything about their Judaism seemed to undergird and strengthen my own experience of being a Catholic. I knew they didn't believe in Jesus like my family did, but I intuited somehow that Jesus was "hiding" in their religion. Like a cat moving under a blanket, ready to emerge at any moment, the Lord was hidden there in a special way.

In the Gospel for this third Sunday of Lent, Jesus says, "For if you had believed Moses, you would have believed me, for he wrote of me" (John 5:46). Stunning words, those. Moses wrote about Jesus. The way therefore that we come to know and believe in Jesus is to discover him lurking in Moses' writings. The Hebrew Scripture is the wonderful womb in which Jesus gestates within a host of images: Adam, Isaac, David, Melchizedek, the Temple, sacrificed lambs, prophets and so on. Right now, in your parish's OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) program, soon-to-be baptized people are carefully studying where Jesus is in the writings of Moses so that they may believe in him. This works for all of us, too, who wish to deepen our knowledge and love of Jesus.

Lenten challenge: Take some time to prayerfully study one of the images of Jesus listed above in the Old Testament. Identify which one you find compelling and consider why this is so. If you don't know where to start, begin with the prophet Jeremiah as an image of Jesus.

• In the parable of the Prodigal Son, in a real sense, both sons are lost. How might you help a lost family member or friend this week?

• As Israel settled into the land of Canaan (the Promised Land), they learned God removed the "reproach" of Egypt from them and they could freely eat from the land. What have you discovered about yourself or others during this season of Lent?

• Paul taught that reconciliation with God and with each other was key to being a "new creation." How often do you experience reconciliation with God or with others?

There is no place for the children to play, not even on decent roads, which are not safe. Where our sister parish is located, the townspeople had to go on strike just to get a road put in. When we visited, there was only a curb with the road to follow. There was no field to play baseball on. The children had to walk miles down a dirt road, cross busy street traffic and go to another town. Hopefully they can "play ball" there someday. Baseball is one of their biggest sports.


