

### THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

### FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT JOHN 8:1-11

"The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle" (John 8:3). Why do they make her stand in the middle? Why not expose her on the periphery? The reason is something that affects us practically every day.

The center is what stabilizes a community's identity. We humans tend to center ourselves around an accused and condemned victim — though we rarely admit it. This renews our fragile communities and our power as those who weaponize the accusation. This is effective because it is often a victim who represents something truly dangerous for the group. In this case, adultery stands for the breakdown of a community and those within because it forces questions like: who is my father? Whose child is this? Is this child one of us or that of an outsider? The accusers place the adulteress in the center because their community, like most, is built around turning an enemy into a victim.

Once you understand this, you'll see it almost anywhere humans group together (families, politics, workplaces, sports, schools, etc.). The good news is Jesus exposes this dynamic by deftly pointing out the sin-infected hearts of everyone besides the woman. They all leave, symbolizing the breakdown of the old order, and she is "left alone before him." A new community has begun, structured around the merciful love of Christ.

What is in your center? What is in the center of our parish and family communities? Strive to center on Christ's forgiveness, and we experience the new, lasting community we call the Church.


### Reflection questions for Sunday, April 13th

- Isaiah bears witness as one who did not lose his faith despite persecution and ridicule. Can you discuss a time when your faith was put to the test?
- Paul teaches the Philippians that Jesus was humble and obedient to God even to the point of death by crucifixion.
   Why do you think humility and obedience are important virtues in following Jesus?
- In his passion narrative, Luke is the only evangelist to highlight that both Pilate and Herod (Antipas) find Jesus innocent of the charges against him. Is there a friend or co-worker you could help this week who is being treated unfairly?



READ. REFLECT. RESPOND. REST.

At Palm Sunday Mass, we start by singing, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" echoing the joyful shouts that welcomed Christ into Jerusalem. Later in the Mass, we recall Christ's suffering and death. No other Sunday in the liturgical year takes us from such an emotional high to the depths of pain and grief. It is the start of Holy Week.

At the 11:00 AM Mass, all parishioners are invited to gather in the Borromeo Hall. The presider will be wearing red. We will hear the introductory prayers, have our palms blessed, hear the Processional Gospel, then process to the church for Mass. At all other Masses, this action takes place in the back of the church, and there is a simple procession. We will wave our palms as the people of Jerusalem did and sing "All Glory, Laud and Honor."

The scripture readings draw us into the mystery of Christ's suffering. We pray the beautiful Psalm 22: "My God, My God, Why Have You Abandoned Me?" During the Gospel, we take part in proclaiming the Passion of our Lord. We hear the crowd yell "We want Barabbas!" and "Crucify him!" and we reverently kneel as we hear that Jesus breathed his last. At Offertory, we sing "Were You There?" At the end of Mass, we depart in solemn silence.

As we relive this mystery of Christ's suffering and death, there are many feelings to unpack. The Son of God rode into Jerusalem in triumph and is now preparing to die. How will you and your family keep vigil this week? How can you talk with your children about sacrifice, giving, and forgiving? As we enter into this holiest of weeks, may our participation in each liturgy draw us deeper into union with Christ and with one another.






Firstfruits Women's Center invites you to a very real, candid conversation with a young wife and mother who is in a battle with stage IV cancer, Amy Fischer.




