

#### THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

EASTER SUNDAY | JOHN 20: 1-9

When I was a young boy, my parents told me about their wedding. Then a few years later they showed me my mother's wedding dress and my dad's suit. It was astonishing to see and touch garments that connected me to the event that led to my existence. Of course, I already believed they were married based on their word, but these holy garments made the event real and tangible for me.

Something like this is at play when St. John reports encountering in Jesus' tomb, "the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place" (John 20:7). Those two separate cloths for his head and for his body, respectively, meant a great deal to St. John and to the early Christians. Some years after the Resurrection, there surfaced reports of two cloths with unusual characteristics, one bearing the image of a crucified man's body, another smaller one with the image of a wounded man's face. Some call them the Shroud of Turin and the Veil of Manoppello; they both can be seen today.

These two cloths have a long and complicated history, and scholars debate aspects of them. If you're curious, I encourage you to read about them. To be clear, I believe in the Resurrection of Jesus because of the testimony of eyewitnesses and the gift of faith in the Church. Nevertheless, seeing these two mysterious cloths have made the life-giving event of Jesus' Resurrection more real and tangible for me. Maybe they will for you, too.

# EASTER & EASTER SEASON April 20TH

#### He is Risen! Alleluia!!!

We have journeyed together through the forty days of Lent. We have worn purple, prayed, fasted, and given alms as we focused our hearts ever more keenly on Christ. Our music and our lives have been more sparing as we prepared our hearts for the great celebration of the Triduum and Easter Sunday.

The Easter Vigil, day three of the Triduum, is on Saturday, April 19th at 8:00pm. We then celebrate our regular schedule of Sunday morning Masses on Easter Sunday. At 7:00 am, we have cantors and a string quartet. At 9:00 am, we have the Bell Choir. At 11:00 am, we have the Adult Choir and a Brass Quartet. There is no 6:00 pm Mass on Easter Sunday. In order to help us celebrate lavishly and well, incense will be used at the Easter Vigil and on Easter Sunday at the 9:00 am and 11:00 am Masses.

Of note this year is that we will be welcoming many new members into the church who have participated in Becoming Fully Catholic with Father Ariel. At the Easter Vigil, we have the honor of welcoming Catechumens, who will receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. On Easter Sunday morning, Candidates will be confirmed in the Catholic faith.

Easter Sunday is the start of the Easter Season, which lasts for fifty days, culminating in the Feast of Pentecost. During the Easter Season, the entire character of our worship changes. Our music becomes brighter and more jubilant. We can proclaim once again the joyous refrain of "Alleluia." "Alleluia" comes from the ancient Hebrew meaning, "Praise the Lord!" It is used in the Mass as a superlative expression of thanksgiving, joy, and triumph since Christ has conquered death. We sing "Jesus Christ is Risen Today" with its chorus of Alleluias. We proclaim the Gospel Acclamation, which uses Alleluia as the refrain and then a verse that summarizes the main idea of the upcoming Gospel reading. Lastly, we are dismissed at the end of the Mass with the priest or deacon chanting: "Go in the peace of Christ, Alleluia, Alleluia!" To which we respond, "Thanks be to God, Alleluia, Alleluia!" This ancient chant ties us to our rich tradition and history as Catholics and reminds us every week of Christ's resurrection and triumph over death. He is risen: Alleluia!




## PARISH OFFICE CLOSED

### ARCHBISHOP GROB'S EASTER LETTER



Why do you seek the living one among the dead?

- Luke 24:5

Hello Everyone,

As you may recall, some women who followed Jesus awaken with a plan that first Easter Sunday morning — to prepare his body properly for eternal rest. They gather the customary supplies and set out for the tomb. If they were concerned about moving the heavy stone at the tomb's entrance, it's unknown to us.

We do know this — two angels greet them with a question: "Why do you seek the living one among the dead?" What a strange and somewhat chiding thing to say to these poor, grieving, well-intentioned women.

However, it is the key question of the first Easter morning and the key question we should ask ourselves as believers every morning: Why do we seek the living One among the dead?

In a moment of graced insight, the women remember Jesus' words, and that remembrance — along with the empty tomb — became the impetus for their new plans: to go and tell his story, to tell their/our story.

He is risen! It is not over. In fact, it has only begun. Don't think that you can go and hide in the empty tomb. He is living in our midst. Go into the streets and look for him! Go to the prisons and soup kitchens, to the ghettos and the fringe areas of life. Go home to your families and acquaintances. He is there among your spouses and children, your coworkers and friends, your classmates and teammates.

In other words — like the women — remember what he told you.

And please realize — like the women — the best part of the story is ahead of you! Happy Easter!




