CREATION CARE TEAM

Bats have vast importance for both biodiversity and human economies. However, North American bat populations are declining due to habitat loss, wind energy development, and the spread of white-nose syndrome. Their disappearance would cause agricultural losses estimated at over \$3.7 billion annually. If you would like to learn more, the Williamsburg Botanical is having a program on October 18 that will explore the ecological roles of bats in Virginia.
