

CREATION CARE TEAM

Millions of real Christmas trees end up in landfill every year. While trees eventually rot, it takes years for them to decompose in landfill, during which it will release harmful methane to the environment. Here are environmentally-friendly ways to dispose of your Christmas tree:

- Turn it into habitat for wildlife by putting the tree in your backyard to provide shelter for birds, or turn it into a birdfeeder by adding suet, fruit slices, or popcorn garlands.
- Chop it up and add it to your own compost heap. For guidance on composting your tree, check out resources or tutorials available online.
- Check your city's website (or Earth911) to find tree recycling programs in your area. These trees are often chipped into mulch, compost, or used in other eco-friendly ways.
- For all of these options, make sure to first remove all decorations and hooks.
