Janice Frazier Coakley died after a short illness April 18, 2024 at Carolina East Hospital in New Bern, NC. She was born on November 25, 1960 in Williamsburg, VA. She was a graduate of Lafayette High School and Colorado State University with a BS in Zoology. As a child, she had a deep love for animals and she spent her career working with animals in several places: Busch Gardens, Virginia Living Museum, several veterinarian offices, Houston Zoo and North Carolina Zoo as a Veterinarian Tech. She retired to Oriental, NC after 27 years of devoted and dedicated service in 2019.

She was a member of the Humane Society of Randolph County for over 30 years. She was president, treasurer, and an advocate for the spay/neuter clinic that she help establish and continues today. Her home housed many cats, dogs, turtles, ferrets, frogs and goats who she either rescued or fostered. She worked endlessly to find forever homes for the pets.

She was predeceased by her mom and dad, Martha and Richard Coakley. She leaves behind a loving family, including her twin sister Virginia and her husband Howard Price, foster daughter Stacey Scott and grandson Colton Wise who will greatly miss her.
