Karen A. Jamison adjourned her last meeting, having passed away on October 31, 2024 after a long encounter with Alzheimer's disease. Her genuine smile and bright, kind and elegant demeanor endured throughout the journey, with her always being able to somehow encourage those around her.

Karen was born to Lloyd and Ellen Faust on October 23, 1946 in Crawfordsville, Indiana. She grew up in the small town of Linden, Indiana and was the eldest of three sisters, including Linda and Gayle. Karen attended and graduated from Indiana University with a Bachelor of Science in Public Health in 1968, whereafter she began her career as a dental hygienist. She then met and later married Thomas M. Jamison in 1970. Karen and her husband moved from Indiana to North Carolina, where Tom completed his radiology residency and they welcomed their first child, Chadwick.

Shortly thereafter, a medical practice opportunity for her husband arose in Williamsburg, Virginia, where they then had their second child, Courtney. Karen was a loving and devoted mother who cheerfully supported her family and their aspirations with her characteristic optimism and generosity.

Karen was regularly involved with a wide range of community minded endeavors, something which came to her naturally. As her children grew, so did her interest in community activities. Karen became involved with the Parent Teacher Association, which progressed to her role as PTA President and then appointment as the Chairperson of Williamsburg James City County School Board. Karen's organizational skills and gift for consensus making were lent to many groups, including the United Way, the Medical Society of Virginia Alliance, WHRO, the Williamsburg Area Council of Garden Clubs, and the Williamsburg Garden Club, the latter of which she chaired. She was also the concurrent chairperson for the Williamsburg Community Foundation, Dream Catchers Therapeutic Riding Center, and the developing Williamsburg Botanical Garden. Karen was a considerate, conscientious, empathetic and engaging ambassador for these organizations, contributing to their mission, growth and benevolent spirit. She was wonderfully capable of allowing people to be their best selves, often in the midst of reasonable controversy. However, she was always mildly disappointed with folks who were not Duke University men's basketball fans.

Karen is survived by her husband, Thomas M. Jamison, MD; as well as their children, Chad and wife, Amanda, of Virginia Beach, and Southern Pines, North Carolina, as well as Courtney and husband, Matthew, with two children, Jamison and Ellen of Ocean Grove, Victoria, Australia. She also has a surviving sister, Gayle Massa (Richard) of Brownsburg, Indiana.
