For each Sunday in Advent, we ask you to prayerfully consider financially supporting the organizations chosen by your Local & Global Outreach Committees. The worthy causes this year include:

- Undue Medical Debt An initiative of the Virginia Conference of the UMC is working with
 this organization to purchases medical debt from insurance and other third-party companies
 for pennies on the dollar, erasing medical debt for the most vulnerable persons in our
 communities.
- **Williamsburg House of Mercy** Provides food, shelter, comfort, and hope to our poor, unhoused, precariously housed, and less fortunate neighbors regardless of faith.
- Hope Family Village A cohousing community planned for Williamsburg to offer acceptance and sustainable support for people with mental health conditions and their families.
- Doctors Without Borders, Sudan Teams in Sudan are treating war-wounded patients with catastrophic injuries and providing humanitarian aid and medical care in refugee camps and displacement sites.
- **Hope in the Mountains: Water Project** Our Covenant Partner is helping people in rural West Virginia get running, municipal water into their homes.
