Friends, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly.

Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die.

But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

If, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled with him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life!

All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation.

We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. Let us be reconciled with God.

- Undue Medical Debt An initiative of the Virginia Conference of the UMC is working with
 this organization to purchase medical debt from insurance and other third-party companies
 for pennies on the dollar, erasing burdensome medical bills for the most vulnerable persons
 in our communities.
- **Williamsburg House of Mercy** Provides food, shelter, comfort, and hope to our poor, unhoused, precariously housed, and less fortunate neighbors regardless of faith.
- **Hope Family Village** A cohousing community planned for Williamsburg to offer acceptance and sustainable support for people with mental health conditions and their families.
- **Doctors Without Borders, Sudan** Teams in Sudan are treating war-wounded patients with catastrophic injuries and providing humanitarian aid and medical care in refugee camps and displacement sites.
- **Hope in the Mountains: Water Project** Our Covenant Partner is helping people in rural West Virginia get safe municipal water into their homes.
