On the Cover: For his "Nativity," Italian Renaissance painter Federico Barroci depicts a tender moment between mother and newborn child. Mary is illumined by light that comes from the infant Christ, and she appears to embrace it with gratitude. At left, Joseph welcomes dumbfounded shepherds at the door, pointing them to the Messiah. At right, an ox and a donkey survey the scene, looming over their repurposed feedbox as if waiting. Straw lies everywhere, trailing down from a hayrack; an errant piece above Mary's head conjures a halo, which would have been characteristic of late 16th-century religious art. Barroci, however, favored the depiction of intimate encounters between ordinary people and the Divine. Indeed, the diagonally-structured composition of the scene seems almost claustrophobic, and was considered quite controversial in its day.
