Mrs. Carolyn Alda Spencer, 86, passed away peacefully on October 6, 2025, in Marietta, Georgia. Born on April 10, 1939, in the Bronx, New York, Carolyn lived a life marked by compassion, service, and unwavering dedication to her family and community.

Carolyn pursued her academic journey with determination and purpose. She earned her Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Delaware and went on to complete a Master of Science degree in Social Work at the University of Springfield in Massachusetts. Her education laid the foundation for a lifelong commitment to helping others.

Throughout her career, Carolyn held several impactful roles that reflected her deep sense of empathy and leadership. She worked as

a Social Worker in Massachusetts, where she supported individuals and families through challenging times.
