HVAC UPDATE



NEW BOILERS ARRIVE ONSITE

We're happy to share that we are now back on schedule thanks to the flexibility and commitment of our contractors, who have added extra crew members and increased their onsite hours to keep the project moving.

In recent weeks, significant headway has been made. The old boiler and outdated piping have been removed, the building's ductwork has been cleaned and sealed, and the layout for new piping has been completed. Crews have poured new concrete pads for pumps and have begun running hot water lines toward Wesley Hall. This past week, they installed the main hot and cold-water lines from the boiler room to the mechanical room near Wesley Hall and completed valve and pipe connections for the lines continuing through that space. The system has now been pressurized and is ready for county inspection. Meanwhile, Chesapeake Controls has made substantial progress pulling low-voltage wiring from individual room units back to the main control panel and is finalizing the wiring plan for all three floors. We're also grateful to share that commitments to our *Lighting the Way* Capital Campaign have now reached **\$1.306.812**—thank you for your continued support and prayers as we work to ensure that our facilities remain a strong foundation for ministry for years to come.
