ORDER OF SERVICE

Our service begins in silence – the echo of a sealed Tomb. Then, at daybreak that first Easter morning, three women make their way to the tomb to prepare the body of Jesus for burial. We join as they hear unexpected news...

ECHOES OF GOOD FRIDAY

from Mark 15& 16

Since it was late in the afternoon on Preparation Day, just before the Sabbath, Joseph of Arimathea dared to approach Pilate and ask for Jesus' body. Pilate gave the dead body to Joseph. He bought a linen cloth, took Jesus down from the cross, wrapped him in the cloth, and laid him in a tomb that had been carved out of rock. He then rolled a stone against the entrance to the tomb. Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James saw where he was buried. When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they could go and anoint Jesus' body. Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they came to the tomb.

THE FIRST EASTER MORNING

from Mark 16

Now the women were saying to each other, "Who's going to roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb for us?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man in a white robe seated on the right side; and they were startled. But he said to them, "Don't be alarmed! You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised!"

Christ is risen!

He is risen indeed!
