

Our 2024 theme comes from the Great Commission that Jesus gave his church:

From him (Christ) the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.

Ephesians 4:16

What a joy it is to be meditating on God's word in Ephesians each week. In the text above, we have a wonderful nugget to inspire our work of Reaching Out, Reaching Over and Reaching Up. Notice that the work of the church does not begin with us but with Christ Jesus. In Jesus, we read. the whole body of Christ is 1) joined together and 2) held together by every supporting ligament. The body being you, the saints of Sebring, are joined together in love for one another and to do the work of the church as a united body. Out of His love, Jesus grows the church and builds it up through love for one another. He does this as the body, being connected with supporting ligaments, does its work of the Great Commission introducing the community of Sebring to Jesus Christ. Love is the ligament that binds and connects God's people.

There are many ways in which we support one another as the body of Christ. First, we keep our eyes on Christ. All that we do we do for the glory of our Savior and Lord Jesus Christ. Lift up Christ in your prayer, giving thanks for the church, asking the Lord to grow and build Sebring First Presbyterian Church. Second, we join in the work. We are not called by Christ to be a consumer but a server.

The Hymns We Sing

(In memory of Pat Harrison of the Caring Christian Women by Pat Rhodes)

Pat Harrison arranged for the CCW to tour the Weigle House Museum in Sebring (this is the yellow house next to the Sebring Library). During our visit we discovered Charles F. Weigle, was born in Lafayette, IN, in 1871. Following studies at the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music, he began a career as a full-time evangelist and song-writer, moving his homebase from California to Sebring in 1915 just three years after the town's founding.

He continued to maintain a residence in the community until 1963. Charles's ministry often took him away from home, leaving his wife and daughter alone. One day, Weigle came home to find his wife had decided to leave him. The strain proved too much for their marriage. She no longer wanted to live the life of an evangelist's wife. His wife took their daughter and indulged in a life of worldly pleasure.

After this season of suffering and struggling with a stronger desire to give everything to the Lord, his ministry and music resumed. Overwhelming abundance and joy returned. As he marveled at the blessings of the Lord. It is believed he wrote this hymn at his home in Sebring.

No One Ever Cared for Me Like Jesus

The words of the title had proven true in the life of Charles Weigle. We also can be confident that "No One Ever Cared for Me Like Jesus" is true for each of us.

At the end of our tour, the docent played the piano and we sang this hymn.

First Stanza:

I would love to tell you what I think of Jesus, Since I found in Him a friend so strong and true.

I would tell you how He changed my life completely; He did something no other friend could do.

Chorus

No one ever cared for me like Jesus; There's no other friend so kind as He. No one else could take the sin and darkness from me; O how much He cared for me.
