
# Thank You

We then got very aggressive with the grinder which moved the sanding along more quickly but broke the grinder!

Several days later we started to paint but learned that the small paint sprayer was too slow so we went to a larger sprayer which really sped things up. Alan Tenn and Gary Ohashi did and still are doing most of the prep work (sanding, taping and covering areas from being sprayed on) which is the hardest part, and is 90% of the work. At this time we have completed about 80% of the project.


We also noticed that the front entrance gate was also in need of repair and repainting. Pastor Sterling came and started work on that gate then we discovered that the gate was not



repairable so we decided to remove the gate and add hand-railings to the stairway. It was a heavy task cutting and removing the gate and hauling away all the cut up pieces. Once again Gary and Alan arose to the occasion and got the job done with much sweat and determination.

There is still work to be done but with the Lord watching over us as we complete the work, may He be honored through these projects.

- Our 15 year old, Adaya, followed in believer's baptism.


- A weekly youth Bible study + hang out time in our home has brought us SO much joy.

The Chinese-speaking churches in town are structured as such that no one under 18 can participate in any part of the worship gathering; instead, they attend a separate English language program for children/youth. Unfortunately, we have found these programs to be light on Bible teaching and heavy on loosely supervised socializing and smartphone use.

After lamenting this reality for well over a year and asking the Lord what role we were to play, we're humbled to have been asked to lead the first ever 'family service' at our church. It will take place on January 29 with young and old gathering together and, if well received, we will aim to continue it once per month.

Linguistically, there are challenges due to the widening culture and language gap between immigrants and their Britishborn children. Yet we still maintain that pursuing mutli-generational unity to the extent possible, and families to worshipping together at least occasionally, is good and healthy for the church. Thanks for praying that God would grant us wisdom and grace in this endeavor—we could not be more excited to start the year in this way!

Chinese Lunar New Year falls on January 22. Our hearts will be extra tender as we gather around the table, prepare our favorite dishes, and speak fondly of memories made in the country we love.

Continue to pray for China. Within a span of a few months, dear friends in our former home saw the pendulum swing from another crushing lockdown and isolating a semester of online school, all the way to full on reopening and rampant community spread of Covid-19. Though it won't be presented on the news, we are hearing from local pastors and friends about the devastating loss of life among the elderly population. Pray for God's mercy to fall upon that land, as many people face a long road of healing ahead.

As we recently marked two years since arriving in the UK, we are keenly aware that your prayers have sustained our family through this transition. Additionally, we are deeply grateful for your faithful gifts to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. Despite the global energy crisis and rising cost of living,

we continue to hear stories of your incredible generosity toward the global mission effort. Thank you for investing in eternity and for equipping us to partner with you!

ver 2 ½ years ago, Hawaii Pacific Baptist Convention asked us to go to Auckland, NZ, to establish a discipleship training center for young adults (ages 18-29) from our Hawaiian churches. We were humbled by the proposal. We aren't really hip people! And we're not experts at discipleship, but we do love passing on the things that God has taught us though our years of ministry in California, Russia, and Ukraine. We do think we are safe people and can create an environment that provides a good setting for young adults to experiment, learn, and grow.

We are going to move to Auckland for 2-3 years. Then churches in Hawaii will send young adults to stay three months to two years. Basically, they will be missionary interns. We will mentor them in the life of following Christ, training them to make and train other followers of Christ, who will then

train others. In other words, we will train them to multiply disciples.

Some interns will probably get a part-time job (like at Starbucks), or take a couple of classes at the University of Auckland, which will give them plenty of opportunities to connect with lots of people. After their term is over, these interns will then go back home to their families, their churches, their careers, or their universities with greater confidence that they can fulfill the Great Commission that Jesus gave to every believer.

One reason we're doing this in Auckland is because English is spoken there, so there is no need to spend time learning another language. Also, because of the concentration of universities in Auckland (60,000-70,000 students), the opportunities for evangelism and discipleship are almost limitless. And it is such

an international setting that our interns will literally get to go to the nations as Jesus commanded.

Right now, we are in the process of getting all of our documentation in order to apply for a visa to live there. We hope to get all of our paper work done and submitted by Thanksgiving. Then we wait for six months for New Zealand to approve our visa. While we wait, we can go back on our visitor visas

and continue to build relationships, make disciples, and lay the foundation for our interns.

We are so grateful to FBC Pearl City for playing a key role in this project. Your prayers, encouragement, hospitality, and financial support show that this is your mission. We couldn't ask for greater partners in the Gospel!
