Frequently Asked Questions



Our passion is for...

"The villages (earth) will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord as the waters cover the Amazon (sea)" (Hab. 2:14 AOV Paraphrase).

According to the Joshua Project, the evangelical presence among the 7 million Ribeirinhos (River People) in the Amazon River Basin is only 9.8%. However, God is moving in the state of Amazonas, Brazil. Evangelical Christianity has grown to 17.5% among the state's 7,600+ river villages. Even more encouraging, growth is projected to reach 50% over the next decade.

We're one of the few ministries mobilizing the American church to the Amazon. Over the past twenty-five years, we've been honored to mobilize over 400 teams with over 8,000 volunteers, minister to over 300,000 villagers, and drill 230 water wells. However, we've only scratched the surface, and we invite you to join us in this movement of God in the Amazon River Basin.

WHAT WE DO

Amazon Outreach mobilizes short-term mission teams to assist Brazilian churches in making disciples by sharing the love of Jesus in the Amazon River Basin. We employ Jesus' holistic approach, which simultaneously meets physical, relational, and spiritual needs. We meet physical needs through medical, dental, and eyeglasses, and provide clean, safe drinking water. We meet relational needs through ministries for men, women, children, and sports. Meeting physical and relational needs builds a powerful bridge for the gospel.

WHY WE GO?

- The people along the Amazon call themselves "The Forgotten People."
- These humble Ribeirinhos (river people) live in deep material and spiritual poverty.
- Villages are often closed to local missionaries, but are very open to our American teams with medical, dental, and water wells (Missionaries call us "The Crow Bar Ministry")
- Villagers have a syncretized religion of Spiritism, Macumba (voodoo), and a diluted Christianity...they are ripe for the gospel of Jesus Christ!
- The great majority of the population has no access to the gospel
- They also do not have access to medical or dental care
- Most villages do not have access to fresh, clean drinking water
- Many children die before the age of five because of water-related illnesses

DILEMMA:

- Because the river is so vast and rises and falls 40 feet each year, the villages are hard to reach and navigate
- Many villages are inaccessible by road
- There are very few organizations like Amazon Outreach ministering to these people groups
- The fields are ripe, but the laborers are few

IS IT SAFE?

There is an inherent risk with all international travel. However, over the past 25 years, we've mobilized over 8000 people, and everyone has safely returned. We have a seasoned Brazilian staff, and each trip is navigated by naval-certified captains, sailors, and cooks. WHAT VACCINATIONS/PRESCRIPTIONS ARE RECOMMENDED?

No vaccinations are required to enter Brazil, but several are recommended by the CDC, such as Hep A & B, Tetanus, Yellow Fever, Typhoid, and a Malaria prescription.

WHAT IS THE COST?

\$1770+air+selected extras.

Your trip leader will provide you with the details for your trip. This price covers airfare, food, lodging, transportation, medical/life travel insurance, and laundry. It does not cover personal items such as passports, vaccines, airport meals, or tips. We provide fundraising training and a personal fundraising link for tax-deductible online donations.

ARE VISAS REQUIRED?

Yes, as of April 2025, eVisas are required and cost approximately \$80. Details can be found on the resources page on our website on the "eVisa" link.

WHAT IS THE AO REFUND POLICY?

Amazon Outreach (AO) is a 501 (c) (3) tax-exempt nonprofit organization. Tax-deductible donations made in support of a trip fee are non-refundable to AO and are not contingent upon a team member's participation on a trip. If a team member has to drop out or a trip is canceled, donations toward their trip will be held as a trip credit (minus potential airline penalties and credits), no less than two years after the original trip date. Expired AO trip credits will be used by AO to further its charitable purposes.

WHAT IS THE AIRLINE'S CANCELED TICKET POLICY?

If an airline ticket has been purchased, the original value of the ticket will be deducted from the team member's AO trip credit. The airline will own the credit (not AO) and must be redeemed through the HighPoint Travel agency for any flight within a year of the original purchase date (not the original travel date). Anticipate that airline credit will be less than the original ticket value due to airline cancellation penalties. Sometimes, AO can use team members' airfare credits with an additional name change fee. If AO can redeem a team member's airline credit, the value of that credit (minus additional name change fees) will be applied to the team member's AO trip credit. This will allow team members an extra year to redeem the value of the airline credit.

WHERE WILL WE GO?

We fly to Manaus, Brazil, where a commercial bus will take the team from the airport to the mission boat (30 minutes). The team will sleep overnight as the boat travels toward our first village. Our Brazilian church partners select the villages we serve.

WHO WILL WE SERVE?

We first serve the hard-working indigenous pastors and missionaries serving in the Amazon River Basin. In partnership with them, we then serve the Ribeirinhos (river people) and Indigenous tribes on the Amazon River.

WHAT WILL WE DO?

We tailor the design of each trip based on the abilities of the team. It can include medical, dental, eyeglasses, VBS, youth ministry, evangelism, water well drilling, and construction projects. We often play soccer as a way to connect. We also creatively utilize other skills, such as hair cutting, fingernail polishing, hair braiding, photography, and journalism. Our last day typically includes some tourism and souvenir shopping.

HOW MANY PEOPLE CAN GO?

Trips require a minimum of 20 people and a maximum of 32 per boat. This can include middle schoolers to senior adults. Twenty to thirty Brazilians will serve alongside the team, including missionaries, pastors, translators, sailors, cooks, and laundry staff.

WHERE WILL WE EAT, SLEEP, ETC...?

The Boat! Our beautiful triple-decker mission boats serve as our transportation, hotel, restaurant, and mission base. We sleep in open-air hammocks, but we also have a few air-conditioned cabins designated as sick bays. There are plenty of electrical outlets for CPAP machines and charging phones. All meals are served buffet-style on the boat by naval-certified cooks. Our cooks can accommodate most special dietary restrictions or food allergies. The boats have five spotless single bathrooms with flushing toilets and seven individual showers with locking doors. Our daily laundry service allows you to pack lightly. We provide these amenities so the team can focus on the mission work.

WHAT DOES A TYPICAL WEEK ON THE RIVER LOOK LIKE?

Every trip can vary significantly, but most follow a pattern based on a 10-day itinerary. Day 1: Travel to Manaus and board the boat, set up hammocks, and spend the night as the boat sets sail. Day 2: Arrive at the first village and start ministry. Day 3-8 Village ministry, Day 9 Return to Manaus (souvenir, explore), Day 10 Arrive home.

WHAT DOES A TYPICAL DAY IN A VILLAGE LOOK LIKE?

Once again, every trip is different, but here's the most common pattern... 6am Sunrise (personal devotions encouraged) 7am Breakfast, 8am Devotion/Team Assignments, 9am-12 Village Ministry (medical, dental, eyeglass, VBS, door-to-door evangelism), 12-2pm Lunch, 2-4pm Village Ministry (same as morning plus Men's and Women's ministries), 4pm Worship Service, 5pm Soccer, 6pm Dinner (sunset), 7pm Debrief/Worship (sometimes worship service in the village, if not held earlier) 8pm Free, 10pm Lights Out.

WHEN CAN WE GO?

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER WE LEAVE?

Our Brazilian church partner will continue to follow up with disciple-making, leadership development, and church planting. Our main partners (Central Presbyterian of Manaus and First Baptist Parintins) have jungle pastor seminars that train lay pastors in theology, hygiene, and other valuable courses. However, we seek churches willing to commit long-term with our Brazilian partner by adopting a tributary and investing in the developing infrastructure. A few examples are yearly trips, participating in jungle seminary training, supporting a river missionary, or building a church in a village.
