Advent Series Continues on December 11 – David and Gia will lead our Advent series this year, "What's the Deal with Revelation?" We'll explore the historical context of the book of Revelation, wrestle with some of its nastier parts, and soak our weary souls in the profound hope at the heart of this book. The series meets on Wednesday evenings from 7:00 to 8:30 pm on December 11 and 18. Bring a Bible and a Book of Common Prayer, if you have them. Childcare is available by advance request; please let Gia or David know as soon as possible if you need it.

**Create a Food Pantry Advent Calendar** – As the Magi brought gifts to the Christ Child, we can bring gifts to our hungry neighbors.
