Emergency Appeal for Blood Donors, Patient Care at Risk - Versiti Blood Center of Ohio has issued an emergency appeal for blood donations due to a dangerously low blood supply. Certain blood types have less than a day's worth of availability, endangering the lives of local patients. When the local blood inventory gets as low as it is now, it jeopardizes the health and safety of patients who rely on life-saving blood transfusions, including organ transplant patients and trauma victims. In some cases, hospitals are forced to postpone surgeries or delay critical treatments. St. John's is hosting a blood drive on Saturday, July 20, 9:00 am to 2:00 pm, in Kilbourne Hall, with Versiti Blood Center, the main supplier of blood to the Ohio State University Wexner Center. You can sign up for a time to donate (before or after picking up your fresh produce and flowers at the Farmers Market) at https://donate.ohio.versiti.org/donor/schedules/drive-schedule/220478. Our goal is at least 15 donors, but let's fill up the whole schedule with 25 people. Together we could save up to 75 lives! All donors receive a voucher for a free scoop of Jeni's ice cream, while supplies last.
