# Ways to Grow

Rescheduled: Sources of Transformation: Where is God at Work at St. John's?

Where is God at work right now at St. John's? Join us to find out together by learning more about the "Sources of Transformation" within parish life, a key model from the College for Congregational Development. The "Sources of Transformation" model teaches that all transformation comes from and through God, but that there are four key means of transformation – means that God works through – that we can evaluate within our congregational life.

Star Blackford and Emmanuel Koomson, who attended the weeklong College for Congregational Development this summer alongside Gia, will present an overview of the model during Adult Formation on Sunday, October 12. Once we have a greater collective understanding of what the model is, Gia, Star, and Emmanuel will lead the parish in participating in the evaluation itself during Adult Formation on Sunday, October 19. Because participation from as many facets of the congregation is critical, a Zoom session will be held the evening of Wednesday, October 15; this session will include both an overview of the model as well as the evaluation exercises and will allow for participation from those unable to attend the Sunday sessions.

We encourage as many parishioners as possible to attend these important sessions to learn together where the Holy Spirit is most at work at St. John's!

## Adult Formation: Ignatian Spirituality

How can I pray? When I have a decision to make, what does God have to say about it? How can I recognize God's voice among the many voices demanding my attention? The spirituality of Ignatius of Loyola, one of the wisest spiritual directors Christianity has ever had, offers us a means to a relationship with God rooted in

prayer, discernment, and self-reflection. Gia will lead this series for adults, which meets on Sundays, November 2 through 23, at 10:15 a.m. in Kilbourne Hall. Nursery care, Godly Play, and Youth Roundtable are offered at the same time.

### Sacred Decision Making Workshop on November 7-8

On November 7-8 Marcia Patton and Nora Percival will present a two day workshop on consensus decision-making at St. Stephen's. Marcia and Nora are the authors of Sacred Decision Making: Consensus in Faith Communities. Consensus decision-making in a church setting promotes inclusivity, is more egalitarian and less patriarchal than other decision-making models, encourages a collaborative spirit, fosters the emergence of unanticipated solutions, offers an alternative to avoiding issues for fear of stirring up trouble, demonstrates the belief that everyone's voice is important, and shows that the people in the room are more important than the decision in question. It embodies the belief that how we work together is as important as what we do and it clearly invites God into the process. Throughout the training Patton and Percival will provide real-life examples, planning and meeting ideas, and essential steps to develop a consensus decision-making model. This training is for anyone who wants to explore a method of decision-making that can truly be considered a "kingdom-practice."

The workshop will take place at Saint Stephen's (30 W. Woodruff Avenue). The Friday evening portion will run from 7:00 - 8:30 PM, and the Saturday session will run from 9-4 with a break for lunch. Attendees are expected to attend both sessions. The workshop is free, but registration is limited. Go to ststephenscolumbus.org to register.

#### October In The Garden Dinner

On Sunday, October 26, St. John's will be serving chili, rolls, oyster crackers, salad, and fruit to our downtown guests at Trinity. You can serve by bringing food to church that day and/or serving with the St. John's team downtown. A sign up sheet and pans with a recipe (optional - use your own recipe for chili if you want) can be found on the atrium table. Your support for this ministry is very much appreciated by the hungry folks downtown!

### Food Pantry

A recent newsletter from the Mid-Ohio Food Collective (MOFC) provided a grim summary of the effects of cuts to federal programs and state support this year:

• "In March, the USDA ended the federal Local Food Purchase Assistance Cooperative Agreement Program (LFPA), which helped food banks support local farmers.

Impact: \$1 million of MOFC's annual food budget eliminated.

- "Also in March, the USDA canceled several federal food orders bound for MOFC, resulting in the loss of several truckloads' worth of meat, dairy, and eggs. Impact: \$1.4 million worth of food orders canceled.
- "In June, the U.S. House and Senate approved nearly \$200 billion in cuts to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, aka food stamps) over 10 years.

Impact: Demand will increase at MOFC markets and pantries.

• "In June, the Ohio General Assembly approved a two-year state budget that rolls back the state's support of food banks to 2019 level despite robust food bank advocacy.

Impact: \$3 million of MOFC's food budget lost (over two years)."

These reductions in support of the MOFC will affect the Worthington Resource Pantry and Gladden Food Pantry as well, since both of them receive food from MOFC. As always, you can support the Worthington Resource Pantry and Gladden Food Pantry with food and toiletry items, or you may prefer to support them or MOFC with financial donations instead.
