Children's Church at Both Services in December

To give each child more personal attention and ease the load on adult volunteers, we will experiment with offering Children's Church at both the 9:00 and 11:15 services on December 7, 14, and 21. We'll see how this goes, then make a decision about continuing (or not) in January.

Advent Series: Prophets

This year's Advent series will focus on the prophets of the Old Testament: what a prophet is, who the prophets were, what they said to ancient Israel, and how they speak to us today. We'll begin each evening with Holden Evening Prayer, a short sung liturgy that's especially appropriate for Advent. Gia and David will lead this series on Wednesday evenings, December 10 and 17, at 7:00 pm in Kilbourne Hall. sugar, gravy, chicken broth, cornbread or hot roll mix, cranberry sauce, canned pumpkin, evaporated milk, pie shells, nuts, mashed potato mix, gingerbread mix, Christmas cookies or candy, turkey cooking bags, and aluminum foil.

Your own Christmas celebration will be more meaningful when you know you have helped others enjoy a festive holiday dinner and healthy meals in December as well.
