### **Food Pantries**

In Advent, we prepare our hearts and minds to receive God's perfect gift to us, His Son Jesus. As our hearts overflow with thanks and joy and love, may we open our hearts to God's children who need a helping hand at Christmas, giving gifts and serving as Christ's heart and hands and feet in the world. In sharing our gifts, we share the love of Immanuel, God with us.

- Have fun creating a Food Pantry Advent Calendar pick up a guide on the atrium table for a great way to observe Advent and help a family. Bring completed boxes to the atrium any time from Christmas Eve through January 4.
- If you host a party during the holidays, invite your guests to bring a Food Pantry donation. Bring the donations to church or deliver them to a Food Pantry of your

choice.

- Help our pantries prepare hundreds of Christmas dinner baskets by adding a "Christmas Dinner" donation to your regular food donations each week. Possible items include canned corn, green beans, sweet potatoes, stuffing mix, spices, flour, sugar, gravy, chicken broth, cornbread or hot roll mix, cranberry sauce, canned pumpkin, evaporated milk, pie shells, nuts, mashed potato mix, gingerbread mix, Christmas cookies or candy, turkey cooking bags, and aluminum foil.
- A turkey or ham and some perishable items will need to be purchased for each of the Christmas baskets, and the food pantries can amplify the impact of every dollar donated.
