#### II. WHAT IS THE PURPOSE?

- a. I Thessalonians: Paul's purposes included expressing gratitude for the Thessalonian's faithfulness, addressing misunderstandings about Christ's return, and providing guidance on Christian living and the importance of maintaining a strong faith despite challenges.
- b. II Thessalonians: Paul wrote Second Thessalonians to address concerns and correct misconceptions that arose after his first letter. He clarified aspects related to the second coming of Christ, warned against false teachings, and encouraged believers to stand firm in their faith.

- a. The theological theme of First Thessalonians revolves around **ESCHATOLOGY**, emphasizing the second coming of Christ and addressing the believers' hope, conduct, and perseverance in light of this future event.
  - *i.* Personal Eschatology—-(4:13-14).
  - ii. Cosmic Eschatology
    - 1. The Return of Christ (4:15-18).
    - 2. The Resurrection of the Dead (4:16) *And the dead in Christ will rise first*.

## VI. WHAT IS POETIC (THE RHETORICIAN-- JUST BEAUTIFUL)?

- a. The Coming of the Lord--1 Thessalonians 4:13–18 (ESV)
- b. **People of the light:** 1 Thessalonians 5:4–8 (MSG): But friends, you're not in the dark, so how could you be taken off guard by any of this? You're sons of Light, daughters of Day. We live under wide open skies and know where we stand. So let's not sleepwalk through life like those others. Let's keep our eyes open and be smart. People sleep at night and get drunk at night. But not us! Since we're creatures of Day, let's act like it. Walk out into the daylight sober, dressed up in faith, love, and the hope of salvation.
- c. **Paul's Benediction** (*Blessing*--Captures the Theology of the Letter) 1 Thessalonians 5:23–24 (ESV)
- d. Stand Firm-- 2 Thessalonians 2:13–17 (ESV)

- e. The Lord is coming so **Be Ready**, **Stay Busy**, **and keep the faith** we don't know when Christ will return (but they were expecting it soon). Don't get slack. Don't be lazy. Don't get complacent.
- f. II Thessalonians: Paul urged them not to become "shaken in mind or alarmed," fearing that "the day of the Lord" (2:2) had already come. Second, he admonished them not to be idle, commanding them that, "If anyone is not willing to work, let him not eat" (3:10).
