different judicial offices for 36 years and is now retired.

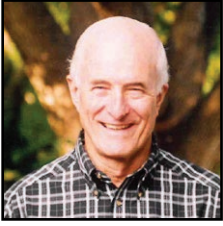


DAVID WEST
