SERIES TITLE: CHURCH ON COURSE **PART ONE:** CONTROVERSY VS MINISTRY

TEXT: 1 TIMOTHY 1:1-11

INTRODUCTION.

Timothy was a young pastor who was mentored by the apostle Paul. After Paul left Ephesus, he put Timothy in charge of organizing the churches. False teachers were endangering the mission. These teachers were speculating about obscure and less important matters, instead of preaching new life in Christ. In this letter, Paul encourages Timothy to deal with this situation and tells him how to move forward in ministry. Although addressed to one person, this letter was intended to benefit the whole church.

Vv.8-11 How can the law be misused? (Galatians 3:24)

- What do you think of this list of sins? Are these the only important ones?
- If you consider how Jesus interpreted the law (Matt. 5:21-28), how many people are guilty of these sins?

APPLICATION.

- When does speculation become wrong and counterproductive to our mission?
- How do we determine what is a "primary" or "secondary" doctrine?

- Can you identify any controversies and meaningless talk that Christians are engaged in today? (try to do this without starting a controversy in your group)
- In your experience, has God been more of a 'lawgiver' or a 'lover'?
- How has your understanding about God changed as you've come to know him?
- FACT: What is a key truth that you understood from this passage?
- REACT: What did you feel?
- ACT: What are you going to do?
