

He knew that what was needed was something new, creative, and costly.


"Come and follow me," Jesus still says.

• The Sacrament of Holy Communion


The Lord be with you: and also with you.

Give us this day our daily bread.


And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.

and in your love to sustain us when the road is uncertain.


Take us from this table, raised and restored,
