There will be times even brothers and sisters in Christ disagree. But even in disagreement we are called to live in submission to God's will, which means peacefully resolving conflict and living in the fellowship of Christian community.

If I find that I am angry or struggling with any other emotion, I say a simple prayer: "Jesus, please take this anger away from me regarding ______. I don't want it any more. Jesus, please heal my soul regarding this anger. Jesus, what do you have for me in exchange?" This is so helpful for me, but I find that I need to be intentional about it. Another practice that I wish I did more is Lectio Divina. At the end of the day, go through these 5 steps: Prepare (Silence), Read (Scripture), Meditate (Reflect), Pray (Respond), Contemplate (Rest). Part of this practice is to think about the day and the times that you felt the Holy Spirit in a situation or not and talk to God about it as well as to confess and set the stage clean for an untroubled sleep and for the next day.
