The Early Learning Academy serves children ages 2 to 5 years. Our class placement (P2, K3, K4, and Bridge) is determined by the child's age as of September 1st. We have full-time and part-time options. We generally have a teacher and assistant per classroom depending on enrollment. P2 classes have 12 students. K3, K4, and Bridge classes are capped at 16 students. Our children participate in Music classes 3 days per week and attend Chapel weekly; Our Bible story is shared with the children daily. 
a word from our athletic director KYLE KENNEDY
