BE A MESSENGER AT THANKSGIVING

Thanksgiving is one of those days that often "just happens." The planning focuses on who's bringing what and when the "big game" is broadcast. This year, consider some new options that may enable you to practice what we have been learning through the most recent Messages preaching series.

As pilgrims in life's journey, who are the people with whom God might have you share Thanksgiving and life. For example, invite a person with no "in-town family," a neighbor or an international student to join you.

Pat Durst has been a CHPC global worker and ministry partner for over 40 years. When she began working with Int'l Friendships at University of Cincinnati, she told us about a need for dinner hosts and friendship partners. She matches an international student or two with a local person/family to experience "Thanksgiving in an American home." Pat says, "God has brought students right to our doorsteps, speaking our language, seeking friends, and curious to know about this culture! Singles, couples,

Nearly all of what historians have learned about the first Thanksgiving comes from a single eyewitness report—a December 1621 letter written by Edward Winslow. He sailed from England aboard the Mayflower in 1620 and founded Plymouth Colony, MA. Just over 50 colonists are believed to have attended, including 22 men; 4 married women including Winslow's wife; and more than 25 children and teenagers. These were the lucky ones who had made it through the first harsh winter.

An epidemic of disease had

swept through the colony, killing half the original group. 78% of the women had died. For the English, the first "thanks-giving" was a celebration of gratitude to God that they had survived their first year in New England. But they hadn't survived alone. Their Native American quests outnumbered the colonists two-to-one. The "Indians" brought a bounty of meat, seafood, and native wild plants.

Though each group had their own traditions of giving thanks, God honored both and forged a new nation out of their gratitude for his providence.

HOW DOES HOSTING WORK?

If you know the person(s), simply make contact and invite them for Thanksgiving dinner well in advance of Thursday, November 28. Determine a time that works for you and the guest(s).

If you're open to hosting an international student, call Pat Durst (513) 324-1268; for more information, Sam Stare, (513) 382-5902. Int'l Friendships often has more requests from students than available dinner hosts. The student(s) will be expecting a call from you. Some students have transportation; others may need to be picked up. Most students speak English well.

HOSTING HINTS (MOST ARE APPLICABLE TO ALL GUESTS) Last Thanksgiving the two girls pictured arrived in time to help us cut out the pieces for "turkey hats." Our 7-year old niece gave us the first pattern. The only thing guests needed to do was add the eyes. Each one was distinctively different and made us all laugh. Notice the name tags.



HISTORY OF THANKSGIVING—When we first started having international guests, we wondered, "How do we explain Thanksgiving?" A friend sent us an internet link to a video in English. It tells the story of an "American Thanksgiving." We played the video and it provided a natural lead into sharing by adults and children. The 6.5-minute video showed the history of the "Pilgrims" coming to America and describes present day Thanksgiving celebrations.

The video is in English with English and subtitles: Go to www.youtube.com and type in "The American Thanksgiving Story." (https://www.youtube.com/ watch?v=-BQSOkkoDjc)

The video has helped the young and old to understand American history and culture, improve their English

listening skills, and foster hearts of thankfulness. It can be used with any small group. The video ends with the question: "What are you thankful for from the past year? Health? Family? Good Education? Food? What? Tell about it, and why you're thankful.

For a bit deeper sharing, especially when strangers are present, it's often easier to talk during dinner. (Children and relatives may be on their best behavior.) We love to say, "Tell us about your name. What is your full name? What do you know about why your parents named you this? From what country does your family come? How did you feel about your name when you were younger? Now? How about nicknames? Any you're willing to share?" Be prepared to model what's expected, and help others remember the series of questions.

SHARE YOUR STORY

Depending on the amount of time you have, ask internationals to tell about something that might be like Thanksgiving in their country or tradition.

Here are some other starter questions. (You can use "thanksgiving" or "being grateful" interchangably.)

- a. Think about someone you know who reflects an attitude of thanksgiving and tell about him or her. b. Name a person or event before your time for which you are grateful (electricity, penicillin, birth of Christ).
- c. Name 5 gifts from God that you can see from where

you are sitting right now for which you are grateful? d. What little things are you grateful for today?

e. Describe something in your life that has taken time to develop for which you are grateful.

f. Tell a story of one time when you expressed your gratefulness and why?

God has connected each of us with people from across the street and around the world to make it easy to share his love. Countries



have also sent students to Cincinnati. You can play a part in God's global plan for those from every tribe and tongue and people and nation to worship God the Father for all eternity.

SUNDAY MORNINGS FOR KIDS

NURSERY (6 WKS - 3 YRS)

Our Nursery is a warm, welcoming and safe place for your baby or toddler to explore, learn and grow. Your child will be well-cared-for by our backgroundchecked and trained volunteer staff, who are devoted to giving your child an awesome first experience of church.

PRESCHOOL - FIRST GRADE

Our preschool through first grade is a great place for your kids to build a foundation of faith. Our teachers come alongside parents to explain the basic building blocks of faith, explore fun hands-on activities, and worship together with age-appropriate music.

2ND - 6TH GRADE

This class builds on foundations of faith and explores how Jesus is real and relevant to our lives. Kids begin to explore the Bible and learn more about the character of God, and why He is trustworthy. Parents are encouraged to keep the conversation going at home.

FAMILY WORSHIP ZONE

Our Family Worship Zone is a special, designated spot in our Sanctuary that offers a safe, kid-friendly space for families to worship together. There are a variety of activities provided for your children, from Kids' Sermon Notes to books and story Bibles to quiet games and puzzles. We hope you'll enjoy worshiping together as a family in this fun, made-just-for-you space!

YOUTH GROUP (4TH - 12TH GRADE)

Our Youth Group is designed to help students know that the Bible is true, reliable, and our guidebook for life. Kids are encouraged to dive deeper into their faith, asking and answering big questions and seeing that Jesus is truly sufficient for our every need. Our teachers walk with our parents in preparing these students to develop a more mature, personal faith.

WHIZ KIDS TUTORING

Whiz Kids Tutoring is a ministry providing fourth through sixth graders at Pleasant Hill Academy with

caring adults to tutor them in reading and basic math, help them with homework, and model Christian character. Whiz Kids is made possible by committed Christian volunteers who are free on Tuesdays from 4:45 to 6:00 PM, who can clear a local criminal background check, and who love kids and can



help them with reading, writing, and basic math.

CHPC's Jesus University was started in partnership with City Gospel Mission in 2015 with 14 girls. Now it has grown to serve 43 girls in two separate ballet classes. Our dancers are mostly from College Hill, and the majority of our girls could not otherwise afford quality private

"CHPC SAFE" FIRST AID TRAINING IS BEING OF-FERED PERIODICALLY BY NIKKI MCKENNA. WATCH FOR UPCOMING DATES. STAFF AND OFFICERS WERE SOME OF THE EARLY PARTICIPANTS. BE PREPARED TO HELP YOUR SPOUSE, CHILDREN, GRANDCHILDREN, NEIGH-BORS, AND OTHERS. YOU'LL THANK GOD FOR IT. "CHPC Safe," a 5-hour class, teaches the latest life-saving skills to respond to and prepare for emergencies, and help you provide assistance in situations like cardiac or breathing emergencies. CHPC Safe exists because it is important to equip individuals with life-emergency preparedness skills. Classes will be hosted by a certified American Red Cross (ARC) Instructor, Nikki McKenna, and are intended for anybody 8 years or older who wants to learn how to save a life. The course

is free. However, if you are able, we suggest a \$50 tax-deductible donation to CHPC Family Ministries to offset costs. Upon completion of the course, you will receive a 2-year certification in Adult & Pediatric CPR, First Aid, and AED from the ARC. More info? Contact Nikki at nmckenna@chpc.org




