FORGIVNESS BEGINS AT THE CROSS

As Good Friday and Easter approach, I am reminded of the incredible grace and forgiveness for our sin that Christ freely won for us by his death on the cross.

Throughout his time on earth, Jesus instructed us to forgive: "When you are praying, first forgive anyone you are holding a grudge against, so that your Father in heaven will forgive your sins, too" (Mark 11:25, or as we pray the Lord's Prayer, Jesus teaches, "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us" (MATTHEW 6:12). Two verses later, Jesus promises, "If you forgive those who sin against you, your heavenly Father will forgive you. But if you refuse to forgive others, your Father will not forgive your sins" (MATTHEW 6:14)

Over the years, I have witnessed the healing journeys of many

individuals. It has become evident that forgiveness is vital to experience healing on many levels. We all experience hurt. Forgiveness is a choice— a choice with serious consequences. Lent and Holy Week are perfect times to embrace new lessons and tools to grow in forgiveness.

Everett Worthington has conducted extensive research on forgiveness. In his REACH Forgiveness model, there are two areas of choice. Decisional Forgiveness is the choice (1) to forgive a personal offense of another (or even one's self), and (2) to let go of angry and resentful (CONTINUED ON PAGE 5)

AN AMAZING MEANS OF EVANGELISM



MUSLIM SCHOOL GIRLS IN KENYA LEARN OF GOD'S LOVE FOR THEM AND THEIR NEEDS.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Last month, the *Bell Tower News* reported on the difference the "Delivering Dignity" ministry was making in the lives of Maasai girls in Kenya. The washable, reusable sanitary pad kits enable girls to regularly attend school during their menstrual periods. Now, they are participating in the world's most popular sport, soccer. This month's story is even more amazing.

Since Delivering Dignity began in Kenya, over 30,000 girls, who have had no access to feminine care products, have learned of God's love for them in a very practical



way. "King David" (PICTURED) heads one of ministry partners, the Healthwise Foundation, that "delivers" free Dignity Kits (washable

pads and panties), female health information, and hope for their

future. Last July, the *BTN* did a story about King David Mulatya's "Add a Room" project that was visited by members of the 2024 CHPC Outreach Team to Kenya. Through the CHPC Endowment Fund, you make David's ministry possible.

On March 19th, during the holy month of Ramadan (a time of fasting, prayer, and reflection until night fall), David and the

Healthwise team went to a very special school for Muslim girls (11% of Kenya's population is Muslim.)

David said,"We shared insights from Second Corinthians 5:10, emphasizing the principle that our works follow us in judgment We did not directly quote Scripture. The team conducted sessions on child development and the

sanctity of human life, fostering meaningful discussions on these critical topics.


Over 280 girls received Dignity Kits ensuring their comfort and well being. Notably, two teachers also requested a Kit, underscoring the importance and need for such support within the Muslim community.

King David said, "It was a fulfilling experience, and we give all glory to God

for His guidance and provision. The Healthwise team has developed great video capability. BARBARA McMullen—"I enjoy singing in Classical Roots and especially look forward to seeing old friends from different churches and backgrounds every year."

thoughts and feelings toward the one who has wronged you. Emotional forgiveness involves replacing negative emotions with positive feelings like compassion, sympathy, and empathy.

FORGIVENESS IS A JOURNEY.
TYPICALLY, Decisional Forgiveness
BEGINS WITH IDENTIFYING THE
PERSONAL OFFENSES AND THE
RESENTFUL THOUGHTS AND FEELINGS.

Recording those through journaling or on individual index cards can be helpful as you *choose* forgiveness. Forgiveness does not dismiss the other person's offense.

Writing helps to clarify the event and illuminate the root of the pain. There are times that we experience an event where we then create the narrative. Such as "I must be *unlovable* if that person did this to me." That is the narrative that only causes more pain and often grows the narrative. It can become more damaging when the event isn't healed.

Emotional Forgiveness involves empathy (trying to accurately understand from the offender's perspective), and altruism (considering a time when someone has forgiven you, and then you offered that gift of forgiveness to the person who hurt you).

In identifying forgiveness, there is often confusion with reconciliation. There are times when a relationship will not be restored because the other person is unsafe or unwilling to take ownership of the offense. Reconciliation is about the restoration of trust in

the relationship. Forgiveness is separate from reconciliation because it is a personal decision.

As followers of Jesus Christ, there is great comfort in knowing that he embodied forgiveness and empowers us to forgive.

Spend time asking Jesus to help you in both Decisional and Emotional Forgiveness. The book Forgiving What You Can't Forgetsuggested this exercise to help facilitate forgiveness:

- Record who you are forgiving.
- Identify the facts of what you are

forgiving, and the <u>impact</u> of the offense on you.

• Then, take a red piece of paper and place it over each offense, praying," And whatever my feelings don't allow for, the blood of Jesus will surely cover."

I encourage you try this forgivenss exercise during the Lenten season. Pause and take inventory of unforgiveness toward others or yourself. "Decide" to forgive.

Again, growing in forgivenss is a journey—often with multiple layers to the journey. At times it is helpful to have someone accompany you on this journey.


