STEWARDSHIP IS AN ACTION WORD!

Randy Alcorn is a *New York Times* bestselling author of more than 60 books including Heaven and The Treasure Principle, and the founder and director of Eternal Perspective Ministries (EPM). He says, "When we take our cues from the world, it's easy to develop a flawed perspective" —on life and stewardship. However, Romans 12:2 calls us to be transformed by the renewing of our minds. That transformation begins with the first principle:

God owns everything, and I am his steward.

If everything belongs to God, we, as wise overseers, must ask God what he wants us to do with what he has entrusted to us. Thankfully, he has provided clear guidance in his Word, the Bible:

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. 2 Tim 3:16-17 NIV Randy uses this example: "Imagine borrowing a pencil from someone and then breaking it in half. If the pencil belonged to you, that wouldn't be a big deal. But if it belonged to someone else, breaking it without permission would be wrong." When we recognize that all we have belongs to God, it changes how we use it, why we use it, and the purpose for which it's used.

FIRST PERSON ACCOUNT: A Different Kind of "Over-Seas" Ministry

ANSWERING GOD'S CALL — IN THE POOL AND OUT

I wanted to share how God's answer to a simple prayer led me to a joyful volunteer experience.

A WHISPER IN PRAYER

It all began with a prayer sometime in the spring: "Lord, what do you want me to do this summer?"

I own a travel agency, and I typically take a summer vacation or two. Not so this year. As a Travel Advisor, in addition to taking care of my clients, there's also travel preparation, which consumes a significant amount of my time. With nothing planned for myself, I knew I would have time on my hands.

The Holy Spirit began dropping two words into my thoughts: swimming ministry. I'd never even considered teaching swimming lessons, so I KNEW it couldn't mean that! But after four or five times, I finally got a clue, and the nudge became clearer.

coolest water with the most adorable swimmers you've ever seen. Their smiles, splashes, and eagerness

reminded me that serving can be simply delightful. Looking back, I've had an adventure I never anticipated. My swimmers ranged from 5 to 81 years old. Quite a spread! I learned to teach level #1 and then was assigned to level #3 (out of 6), something I did not feel prepared to do.

The weather ranged from stifling heat in June to cold with thunderstorms during the final week of swimming, July 28-Aug 1...

My ongoing prayer was, please don't let me mess up anyone's kid.
My deepest desire and prayer were to be his love to my swimmers and to know that GOD would be glorified.

Elizabeth Mock has achieved a special milestone on SonLight Power trips. She's one of the first to accomplish a trifecta of sorts, participating on SonLight Power trips in three distinct life stages: as a youngster, teen, and now as an adult.

In 2008 at age 11, Elizabeth joined her family on a church-sponsored trip to Honduras with SonLight

Power. Five years later in 2013, she returned to Honduras on a SonLight Power trip with her youth group.

In November 2024 and June 2025, Elizabeth made her 3rd

and 4th SonLight Power trips to Honduras. This time, she was on a church team that included her mother-in-law Susan, husband Samuel, and mother Claire Snyder.




For Elizabeth, each trip she's taken has been impactful in its own unique way. But all four trips have shared two things in common: using the power of the sun to equip remote, isolated school communities with reliable electricity for the first time, and using the power of the Son, Jesus, to share God's love with children and communities. Nathaniel Gumbs In Concert Sunday, September 28, 2025, 3:00 PM

Nathaniel Gumbs, a native of the Bronx, NY, has performed throughout the United States and abroad, including Antigua, St. Thomas, Ghana, Paris, and Munich, and is consistently gathering new fans and followers. *The New York Times'* review of Nathaniel's concert with bass-baritone Dashon Burton describes their performance as "mature, lyrical, accurate and energetic," and Nathaniel's playing as done "deftly and with feeling."

Dr. Gumbs currently serves as Director of Chapel Music at Yale University where he works with students, faculty, and guests to coordinate music for three worshiping communities: the University Church in Battell Chapel and at Yale Divinity School in both Marquand Chapel and at Berkeley's Divinity School. He earned his undergraduate degree from Shenandoah Conservatory in Virginia, his Master of Music degree from Yale University, and his Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the Eastman School of Music. Nathaniel's principal teachers include Steven Cooksey, David Higgs, and Martin Jean.

Prior to his position at Yale, Dr. Gumbs served as Director of Music and Arts and church organist at Friendship Missionary Baptist Church in Charlotte, NC, where he led several hundred volunteer musicians and staff in four choirs and other ensembles. Nathaniel currently serves as the Interim Minister of Music and Fine Arts at the historic Abyssinian Baptist Church in Harlem, NY.

In 2017, *The Diapason* magazine recognized Nathaniel as one of 20 outstanding organists under 30 years old for his achievement in organ performance and church music. In 2018, Nathaniel curated the opening Hymn Festival (Singing Diverse Music in the New Church) for the Hymn Society's annual conference. He is also featured on various recording projects with James Abbington, and award-winning conductor, Jason Max Ferdinand. He has recorded revised choral works by Margaret Bonds with New York Philharmonic's Chorus Director, Malcolm Merriweather. Most recently, Dr. Gumbs is a contributing composer to *Pulling Out The Stops, Volume 3, Congregational Song Accompaniments for Organ*, published by Augsburg Fortress.
