

My daughter-in-law is a marathon runner. She has run marathons in several different states over the years. Marathon runners, whether they know it or not, pay homage to the legend of Pheidippides. As the legend goes, he ran all the way from the Battle of Marathon to Athens – roughly twenty-six miles – to proclaim the Greek victory over the Persians in 490 B.C. As soon as he crossed the city's threshold, he declared, "Rejoice, and we rejoice!" He then immediately collapsed and died.

Though the accounts do vary, the idea beautifully parallels St. Paul's call to rejoice. "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!" (Philippians 4:4). We are entering the season of Advent. In our worship services over the coming weeks, we will light another candle on the Advent wreath every Sunday and remember the gifts that our Savior Jesus delivers to us – Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.

Is joy your first emotion, your first thought, when you think about the Christmas season. Sometimes we think of all the things we have to do in the month of December – shopping, wrapping, decorating, baking, cleaning the house and planning a meal for the big family gathering, updating that Christmas card list – and we feel less than joyful. Exhausted. Exasperated. Overwhelmed. But hardly joyful.

It's important for us to remember that true joy, real and lasting joy, does not come from ease of life or the material things of this world. Our greatest joy comes from the victory of life over death and the deliverance from the enemies of sin and Satan that our Lord Jesus has won for us. Greater than the victory of the ancient Greeks over the Persians, Jesus came into the world as the Babe of Bethlehem to one day defeat sin and Satan at the cross. By His death and resurrection, He has won for us the gift of eternal life with God forever. There is much to do these days, but please take time to remember the joy that Jesus brings. With Paul we can say it and then say it again: Rejoice!

Thank you to the members of Covenant for your faithful giving throughout the year. Your generous contributions throughout the year make our ministry together possible. The Treasurer's Report as of October 31 shows a positive cash balance. Total income to date is \$454,836 which includes offering income, childcare income, and income received from the Northwest Lutheran School lease. Offering income for the first ten months of the year is up \$10,000 over the same period last year! We have had some expenses for building and grounds that have exceeded our planned budget. These include parking lot repair and some boiler repair and maintenance. Even with those extra expenses, we still have a positive balance. Praise God!

### Christmas Eve, December 24 at 4:00 & 7:00 p.m.


