As we celebrate Independence Day this month, the Fourth of July, we celebrate freedom. The original 13 colonies, back in 1776, desired freedom from British rule. The United States of America was established with certain rights and freedoms like freedom of speech, the right to bear arms, and freedom of religion. We should never take those freedoms for granted. Those freedoms came at great cost and they are precious to us.

Many of you are no doubt familiar with the story of Harriet Tubman. She truly understood how precious freedom is. Harriet's grandparents were members of the Ashanti people of Ghana. They were kidnapped from their land in 1725 and sold into slavery. Harriet was the third generation in her family to live as slaves. But Harriet Tubman became a link to freedom, not just for her family, but for hundreds of other slave families as well. She became the most famous conductor on what has come to be called the "Underground Railroad."

Harriet's flight from slavery was sparked by rumors that there were plans to sell her and two of her brothers to a chain gang. So she decided to escape. She traveled mostly by night and hid in fields and barns during the day. There were designated stops along the way at the homes of those sympathetic to the cause of freedom. Her destination was the Northern states, or even Canada, were many escaped slaves made their homes. The fact that this lone woman successfully traveled to freedom is remarkable enough in itself. The fact that she chose to return to slave country hundreds of times to lead others on the Underground Railroad to freedom is astounding. She risked capture, beatings, jail time, and even death to help others out of slavery. Harriet Tubman was once quoted as saying, "I freed thousands of slaves. I could have freed thousands more, if they had known they were slaves."

Think about that. There are many people today who are slaves and don't even know it – slaves to dangerous and sinful habits, slaves to materialism and the desire for more and more things, slaves to self-defeating attitudes and degrading lifestyles, slaves to the false idea that our good works will get us into heaven. The Bible says that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). We all sin. By nature, we are all slaves to sin and captives of the devil.

Thanks be to God that Christ our Lord has set us free. Our freedom from sin, death, and the devil cost Jesus his very life. On the cross of Calvary Jesus died as the once and final sacrifice for our sin. He rose again in victory over death and the grave and now, by faith in Christ alone, we are forgiven and free. St. Paul says in Galatians 5, "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free."

As you celebrate Independence Day this month, remember the rights and freedoms we enjoy as Americans. Remember also, and give thanks, for the freedom from sin and the gift of eternal salvation we have in Jesus Christ.
