

FROM THE PASTOR

You've heard me say this many times before. The world is becoming more and more un-Christian all the time. Recent events like the tragic shooting at a Catholic church and school in Minneapolis and the assassination of Charlie Kirk at a Utah college campus on September 10, remind us that the persecution of Christians and the hatred of Christian beliefs will only increase over time.

The world and the devil hate what Christians believe and confess. Many refuse to accept the Bible's teaching that God created the world in six 24-hour days and that Jesus is the only way to heaven. Even more aggravating to unbelievers are the convictions of conservative Christians on many moral issues like abortion and same-sex marriage and transgender issues. We can find example after example of the hatred and animosity directed toward Christians because of these beliefs.

In times of fear, threat, and uncertainty, the natural inclination is to run and hide. But as Christians who believe and confess what the Bible teaches, we must stand our ground. Whether it's in daily conversations with friends, neighbors and co-workers, or in our social media posts, we must hold tightly to the teachings of Scripture, the clear Word of God.

Even though there is much spiritual darkness, we, as people of God, have a hope that is not of this world. In John 16:33, Jesus says, "In this world you will have trouble, but take heart, I have overcome the world." There is darkness all around us. Those who choose to live and walk in the light will face trials and tribulations. But our Savior, Jesus Christ, has already won the victory over this present darkness.

October is Reformation month. Five hundred years ago, Martin Luther faced the threat of physical violence and even death because he took a stand against the Church of his day. He spoke out against the false teachings of the Church and helped people see the truth of God's Word – forgiveness of sins and eternal life are a gift granted by faith in Jesus Christ and not through good works. Luther refused to back down and recant his position and today we are blessed by those Reformation principles of Grace Alone, Faith Alone, Scripture Alone.

We, too, must have the courage and confidence of Martin Luther. We, too, must stand on the truth of God's Word. Jesus tells His disciples in Matthew 5:14, "You are the light of the world . . . Let your light shine so that others may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." We are called to stand together as lights in the darkness. May God enable us to stand firm on the truth of God's Word and defend our Christian faith.

Estate Planning & Will Preparation

The Lutheran High School Association of Greater Milwaukee is now offering help in developing an estate plan. Do you have an estate plan (a will or living trust) that specifies how you want your money and other assets distributed after your death. Only 42% of U.S. adults have an estate plan in place.

For a fee of \$500 you can meet with Craig Mellendorf of SFC Estate Coaching who will collect information and develop a plan for your estate AND then meet with an attorney to put in place your will or living trust. This is a fraction of the cost you would incur if you went directly to an attorney to develop your estate plan.

You worked hard for the assets you've accumulated. Make sure you are the one to determine who gets what, when, and how. You can even find out how to reduce or eliminate taxes by leaving a charitable contribution.


