OLD TESTAMENT Nehemiah 8:1–3, 5–6, 8–10 (Ezra reads the Word of God.)

8 ¹ all the people came together as one in the square before the Water Gate. They told Ezra the teacher of the Law to bring out the Book of the Law of Moses, which the Lord had commanded for Israel.

²So on the first day of the seventh month Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, which was made up of men and women and all who were able to understand. ³He read it aloud from daybreak till noon as he faced the square before the Water Gate in the presence of the men, women and others who could understand. And all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law.

⁵ Ezra opened the book. All the people could see him because he was standing above them; and as he opened it, the people all stood up. ⁶ Ezra praised the Lord, the great God; and all the people lifted their hands and responded, "Amen! Amen!" Then they bowed down and worshiped the Lord with their faces to the ground.

⁸ They read from the Book of the Law of God, making it clear and giving the meaning so that the people understood what was being read.

⁹Then Nehemiah the governor, Ezra the priest and teacher of the Law, and the Levites who were instructing the people said to them all, "This day is holy to the Lord your God. Do not mourn or weep." For all the people had been weeping as they listened to the words of the Law.

¹⁰ Nehemiah said, "Go and enjoy choice food and sweet drinks, and send some to those who have nothing prepared. This day is holy to our Lord. Do not grieve, for the joy of the Lord is your strength."

Lector: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

HOLY GOSPEL Luke 4:16–30 (Jesus declares Himself to be the promised One.)

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the fourth chapter.

¹⁶ He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read, ¹⁷ and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written: ¹⁸ "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, ¹⁹ to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

²⁰ Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him. ²¹ He began by saying to them, "Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing."

²² All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his lips. "Isn't this Joseph's son?" they asked.

²³ Jesus said to them, "Surely you will quote this proverb to me: 'Physician, heal yourself!' And you will tell me, 'Do here in your hometown what we have heard that you did in Capernaum."

²⁴ "Truly I tell you," he continued, "no prophet is accepted in his hometown. ²⁵ I assure you that there were many widows in Israel in Elijah's time, when the sky was shut for three and a half years and there was a severe famine throughout the land. ²⁶ Yet Elijah was not sent to any of them, but to a widow in Zarephath in the region of Sidon. ²⁷ And there were many in Israel with leprosy in the time of Elisha the prophet, yet not one of them was cleansed—only Naaman the Syrian."

²⁸ All the people in the synagogue were furious when they heard this. ²⁹ They got up, drove him out of the town, and took him to the brow of the hill on which the town was built, in order to throw him off the cliff. ³⁰ But he walked right through the crowd and went on his way.

SERMON OUTLINE

"Delight in the Lord"

Nehemiah 8:1-3, 5-6, 8-10

Introduction: During the time of the Babylonian Captivity, Nehemiah received permission to lead a group of Jewish exiles back to their homeland to repair the walls of Jerusalem and rebuild the temple. Our text takes us to the time when Ezra gathered the people together and read for them the books of Moses.

I. The Word of God brings a response of joy and thanksgiving.

- The Israelites who heard the Word of God responded by shouting "Amen!" and worshiping the Lord.
- What is our response to the Word of God? The message of Scripture should be as captivating and exciting for us as it was for Ezra's audience.

II. God made the world and everything in it.

- The other cultures around Moses Egypt, Greece, Mesopotamia viewed the sun, moon, and stars and a host of other things as gods who controlled the events on earth.
- Moses declares that there is one God who created the universe.
- Human beings are not the product of chance or evolution. Adam and Eve are the crown of God's creation, created in His image.

III. We are part of God's salvation story.

- God delivered His people from slavery in Egypt and brought them to the Promised Land. He brought the exiles back from captivity in Babylon. God will also deliver us from our problems and troubles and lead us home.
- God fulfilled His promise to send a Savior. By faith we know Jesus as the Son of God who died and rose again to save us from sin and death. The message of God's Word is so wonderful, we share it with all people!
