- ¹⁸ Open my eyes, that I may behold
wondrous things out of *Your Law*.

not *Your Commandments* from me!
- ²⁰ My soul is consumed with longing
for *Your Rules* at all times.

BOUNTIFULLY – Giving in Abundance

- Asking for “a lot” from God is fine

Why? “That I might keep **YOUR WORD**”

OPEN MY EYES – You change, Not God

- Scripture is **FULL** of His Truths and His Wonders. Prayer - “*God, open my eyes*”

SOJOURNER – Temporary Resident

“But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ.”

²³ Even though princes sit plotting against me, Your servant will meditate on *Your Statutes*.

²⁴ *Your Testimonies* are my delight; they are my counselors.
