







PASTOR COREY 2026 BOOK CLUB






AUG 27: THE WIDENING OF GOD'S MERCY


SEPT 24: WE SURVIVED THE END OF THE WORLD


OCT 22: THE TEARS OF THINGS

Richard Rohr offers a deeply pastoral and wisdom-filled journey through the voices of the biblical prophets that helps readers move from anger and despair to compassion and hope.




NOV 12: HELL BENT
