## "REJOICE IN THE LORD ALWAYS: THE JOY OF JESUS | PHILIPPIANS 4:4-7 "

One of the trademark characteristics of Christians is expressing joy. Joy is described as "a feeling of great pleasure and happiness." Non-believers might ask a Christian, "why are you so happy all the time? Why does it seem like nothing bothers you?"

A related word, "rejoice" is often used in Scripture or sung in our praise. This is perhaps a more accurate term for how we should live our

Christian lives: to "feel or show great joy or delight". I prefer this phrase, because it's not just sitting with joy and holding onto it: you are physically displaying your inward delight.

Lutherans can sometimes get a bad rap for being stodgy, cold, grumpy... are we rejoicing in the Lord always? Every day — all the time? I can say that I have not. I'm guessing that you have also had days when you did not feel like rejoicing.

- When you are sick longer than you wanted to be, or the diagnosis is unclear
- When work becomes taxing or difficult
- When you're at odds with your spouse or having a tough time with your children
- When you lose a family member or a loved one

We are all guilty. It is tough to rejoice during difficult times. But Paul in Philippians wrote that we should rejoice always...

was Paul delusional? He even wrote this portion of Scripture under house arrest awaiting a trial. To have this idea while filled with unknowing and anxiety... is this just wishful thinking?

No – we CAN and are commanded to rejoice in the Lords ALWAYS!

God has taken our sin – forgiven us – and our sin is as far away from us as the East is from the West. That is worthy of rejoicing!

The Lord is always with us (Matt. 28:20). He is always near to us (Psalm 34:18). He has gone through the same trials we have and understands us (Heb. 4:15). Can we rejoice over that? Yes!

The final verse of this section says “And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.” (Phil. 4:7) Paul doesn’t write that the peace might do these things, or hopefully keep your hearts and minds – he writes that it will. That’s a promise! Throughout all of the difficulties of life that we lose understanding, peace will keep us in Christ Jesus. We can certainly rejoice for that!

So – how can we display our joy to others?

- Trust in God when you are ill and look to Him for strength.
- Work as though you are serving the Lord (Col. 3:23-24).
- Show the love of Jesus to your spouse and family.
- Comfort those in times of loss by sharing God’s Word

Making your joy evident in your life can draw others to rejoice in Jesus with you. When you’re at church, make your joy evident in your speaking and singing around members and visitors. In public, be positive and upbeat to friends and strangers. Rejoice in the Lord – always!

## JULY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

**Children's Ministry Update:** Savannah shared her plans for AWANA, Sunday School and Family events for the upcoming school year. She gave a brief update on VBS. She is looking to hire replacement staff for the nursery. Savannah will be completing her final course for her DCM Certificate in August, at which point the congregation will extend her Divine Call.

**Associate Pastor Ministry Update:** Pastor Adam gave a brief update on all the things he is working on which include the standard pastoral functions, along with Small Groups, Bereavement Ministry, Celebrate Recovery, Night to Shine and The Gathering Place. He has scheduled visits with the ECC as well. His orientation has gone well, he had lots of one-on-one meetings with staff and congregation members.

**June Fiscal Year End:** The church ended the year with a deficit of \$22,224. In March we were anticipating a deficit of over \$80,000. The Congregation responded to need! The Gathering Place ended the year with an unusual deficit. They will have a price increase in July, which will help things for the upcoming year. A comparison of previous fiscal year ends was shared.



**2025-26 Home Mission and Mission Partner Scrip Allocations:** The Church Council approved support. It was noted that The Upper Room will be closing, so they were removed from the allocation.

**HVAC Controls:** Chad Berke spoke with Aldag Honold to ensure the control upgrade was appropriate and includes moisture pucks. The Council approved the upgrade not to exceed \$8,500.

**Parking Lot Medians:** Following the parking lot upgrade, the recommendation was to make the medians very low to allow for water to run through them. Unfortunately the only thing we are able to grow is weeds. The Council would like to have a “serve day” the first Saturday in November, inviting Congregation Members to till up the medians, add topsoil and plant grass.

**Elder Team Update:** Pr Kyle’s sermon series plans were reviewed through Thanksgiving 2026. Membership was also discussed.

**Senior Pastor Update:** Pr Kyle shared the quarterly membership report. He is working on contacting regular worship attenders that suddenly stop attending to see if he can assist in any way. Red Letter Challenge will be returning for Lent. This was cut short in 2020 due to Covid. The Rooted Series will be done in Fall 2026, which is something Pr Adam has recommended. AIM is scheduled to begin again in Fall.

**Columbarium Thank You:** Donna Felch extended a thank you to John Rische and Stefanie Trakel for working on the Columbarium project. Small electrical and plumbing portions still need to be completed. The landscaping will be done in mid-September. The flag will remain at full staff flag at all times.

**National Youth Gathering Thank You:** Michelle Zuengler shared the amazing impact of the National Youth Gathering on the kids that attended as well as herself. She thanked everyone for their support and prayers.
