#### Things to Do Outside with Your Preschooler

- Build a fort using lawn furniture.
- Film a home movie.
- Find a shady tree and read.
- Go "fishing." Set up a wading pool with objects and let your little one try to catch them.
- Host a <u>nature scavenger hunt</u>. Look for pine cones, acorns, and other common outdoor items and tally who found the most pieces.
- Is it getting dark outside? Play hide and seek with flashlights
- Water the plants. Give your preschooler some basic experiments to consider: Does the hose make water come out faster than the watering can? Which is easier to control?
