During the month of October, we had themes about leaves/pumpkins, fire fighters, safety signs and we began fairy tales/nursery rhymes.

The learned about the seasons, especially fall. We looked at different kinds of leaves and their parts. We also learned about the different parts of a pumpkin by carving one and we made pumpkin pudding cups. They were quite yummy!

During the fire fighters/safety theme, the children leaned how to "Stop, Drop and Roll", could name different safety signs and when to call 9-1-1. They also learned how to stay safe when playing, especially outside. This included staying away from strangers.

For our Jesus' time, we had stories about Abraham (obeying/trusting God), Isaac being born (learning to wait), Joseph and his brother's jealousy and for-

giveness) and Moses (God has a plan and is always with us).

Alphabet

The 4K class has been focusing on 2-4 letters a month. We look at pictures and objects beginning with the letter, read stories about things beginning with the letter and do some type of art project that relates to one of the things.

During the week, your child glues something that starts with the letter onto the letter in their journal.

The children also practice printing the letters, thinking of words that start with the letter, and find the letter mixed in a group of other letters.

A few times this year, your child will be asked to fill a box with things that begin with the letter of that week. Then your child will share all the objects with the class,

and we will guess which letter he/she had.

It is a lot of fun to see how excited each child gets when it is his/her turn to share

Knowledge and Skills

Listening and Understanding:

- 1. Derives meaning through listening to communications of others and sounds in the environment.
- 2. Listens and responds to communication with others.
- 3. Follows directions of increasing complexity.
- Show-n-Tell allows your child to talk as well as listen to what others are saying.
- Jesus' time and circle time involve a lot of talking and listening to get meaning from the discussion.
- We give directions all day long from "Boys stand up" to multiple step directions for creating an art project.

Speaking and Communicating:

1. Uses non-verbal gestures and movements to communicate.

- 2. Uses vocalizations and spoken language to communicate.
- * Actions are taught for most songs we sing.

Early Literacy

- 1. Shows an appreciation of books and understands how print works.
- Develops alphabetic awareness.
- 3. Develops phonological and phonemic awareness.
- 4. Demonstrates the use of strategies to derive meaning from text.
- We try to read at least one book a day as a group.
- Activities involving letter recognition as well as letter sounds occur every day.
- We create class books.
- Each child dictates an idea that is written down when choosing a picture from a special day or activity for their own book.
