As we head into our 17th year next spring, it's amazing how far we have come in what our days look like here at The Gathering Place. More days offered, more participants able to participate, additional location, more staff and lots of volunteers, plus our Memory Matters class for those with early memory loss. While reviewing our budget to identify potential changes needed, we saw an increase in music and entertainment costs, as well as the

importance of our scholarship fund. Established 10 years ago, the scholarship fund ensures that our program remains accessible to everyone, especially when funds from the county, VA, or long-term care insurance are unavailable after the vetting process.

"My husband had been going to TGP for a year for two days a week. It's the perfect fit for him: he needed to be active and socialize in a comfortable setting because he is so young and I still needed to work. I knew we had a long journey ahead of us with his diagnosis. The unknowns are terrifying. But TGP has been the one constant in my husband's life that he truly enjoyed, he is thriving there! But when I had to quit work because of my own health, finances became very tight. We used up funds we received from a grant and I was sad to tell him we had to cut back to one day a week. When talking with staff at TGP they found a way to make it work to continue two days a

week. The scholarship has been such a gift to us and I'm so grateful to all who donate to this as it is truly maintaining my husband's independence." Anonymous

The children and teachers have gotten to know each other and are having lots of fun learning each day. The children are becoming familiar with the school routines and beginning to make new friends.

SEPTEMBER COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

WORSHIP MINISTRY UPDATE: So far the worship service times continuing into Fall have been working. There has been some feedback asking if the Choir could sing during the 9:30 Worship Service as well. At this point the decision was to keep the 8 am service Traditional and the 9:30 Contemporary.

The music ensembles have had a few new members, but we still need more musicians. Thomas has worked with the praise teams on a devotional series, encouraging team members to connect more with congregation members.

We still have livestream issues at times, it is sporadic and difficult to determine the cause. Thomas continues to be involved in various activities with children's ministry, ECC and TGP. He's also created a SWD Worship Director Group to begin collaborating.

CAMP LUTHER FALL MISSION TRIP & THREE LAKES JUNE MISSION TRIP: These trips were approved.

ELDER TEAM UPDATE: The Elder Team reviewed the membership report. They also reviewed the Call process.

SENIOR PASTOR UPDATE: We have had a tremendous amount of hospital visits, hospice, and funerals as of late. Pr Tom is assisting Pr Kyle with these.

The Call Team is established with 7 Pastors willing to go through the process and 4 that would seriously consider a Call. We hope to hold interviews in the next two weeks.

The Apostles' Creed Series has kicked off. There are 9 small groups working through it. We've had 4-6 new people also join small groups. Pr Kyle is currently doing the AWANA closing during Savannah's maternity leave. AIM will be 2 Saturday mornings, there are 20 people already signed up. Feed My Starving Children is ready, with 625 volunteers registered, all slots are full. The Tuesday Morning Pastor Bible Study has begun, with a very large group of around 60 people.

The SWD is seeking nominations for District President and Vice President, which will be voted on at the District Convention in June 2025. The Council will recommend Pr Nathan Meader for President and Pr Bryan Osladil for Vice President.

WALK IN - COMMUNION: The 9:30 Sunday Worship Service is running very long, especially on communion days. It was requested that the Elders discuss potentially switching to continuous communion temporarily during the 9:30 worship service.


