## LONGING FOR THE GOSPEL

What do you long for?

Is it a favorite food? How about time with your loved ones? Perhaps you long for a refreshing vacation or maybe for some nice fall weather!

Do you long for what advertisers put in front of you: a new vehicle, some new clothes, a recently approved medication that promises all the answer for your health, or some yummy fare from your favorite restaurant? Do you long for relief from our broken world: peace among the nations, that our culture would magically change, solutions to hunger and poverty, or help for the ill and disenfranchised?

Peter talked about what the angels long for. As he described the Gospel preached by the prophets and empowered by the Holy Spirit, the apostle noted that there were "things into which angels long to look." (I Peter 1:12) Angels long to look into the Gospel- God's revelation of grace, the sending of His only Son who, because of God's unconditional love, gave His life for our sins on the cross, rose from the dead, and by His Spirit through Word and Sacrament, clothes us with His righteousness, all as a complete gift with no merit or worthiness on our part. Angels long to lean into this wonderous and incomparable work of the Almighty God for us fallen human beings, who

now have the privilege of being called, "Children of God."

The word used for longing in the Bible is epithumeo. It is the same word the Bible uses for "covet" or "lust." It is a strong word of desire. The word describes deep and extraordinary longing, and it helps to properly direct our longing.

As fallen sinners, our longing can so easily become misdirected. Misdirected longing can become selfish idolatry. Selfish idolatry may allow us to get our way, or to gain the world, or to feel good for a while, but in the process to lose our soul and to conceal the Gospel.

That's why the angels are on the right track. Jesus directed us to the one thing we all need, the one longing that leads to life. As Martha scrambled around to put her house for the Son of God, Jesus directed her to Mary, who sat at His feel listening to Him. Jesus said, "One thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the good portion, which will not be taken away from her." (Luke 10:42) Mary longed for the Gospel. She longed for Jesus and His Word of life.

As summer is gone and fall is here, what are you longing for? Do you long to join us in worship, Thursdays at 6:30, Sundays at 8 or 9:30 AM? Do you long to get your kids involved in AWANA and Confirmation (starting Sept 4), or Sunday School and Youth Group (starting Sept 8)? Do you long to join us for Bible study this fall as we launch into the Chosen Video's on Tuesday Mornings (starting Sept 10). Do you long to join a small group when we kick off a church wide look at the Apostle's Creed in mid-September? I hope so!

Come and see - invite your friends! Join us as we long to taste and see the goodness of our Lord (Psalm 34:8). For when we gather around God's Word, when we receive His gifts, we receive life.

Questions for reflection: Read 1 Peter 1:1-13, How do these verses describe what the angels long to see?

What tends to get in the way of your setting your hope fully on God's grace (vs. 13)?

Prayer starter: Ask God to help you set your heart, hope, and action on first receiving and then living out the Good News of Jesus.

Greetings from The Hispanic Outreach members! The Lord continues His work doing great things through the Hispanic Ministry in Sheboygan County. Thanks be to God!

Operation Backpack 2024 Sponsored by The LCMS Sheboygan County Hispanic Outreach- For the past six years the community of Sheboygan and its surroundings has been served by the effort of the Hispanic Outreach and the sisters churches in Sheboygan lead by Rev. Blas. In these six years, more than 700 backpacks and school supplies have been distributed in the community. What a great joy and pleasure it has been for us to see many happy faces throughout the years.



This year, like always the event took place at "Iglesia Luterana El Buen Pastor" in Sheboygan on Saturday August 3rd. Thanks to the Lord the event was a successful one! We had a great event! We blessed so many families and kids. Thanks to the donations from our sister churches, their members, and community members, we had prepared 132 backpacks and school supplies to be distributed the day of the event, but so many people arrived that we had to work quickly to prepare 20 more backpacks with supplies. At the end of the day, thanks to everyone's effort and the volunteers, we served a total of 41 families and distributed 152 backpacks to the children of our community. Also, after the day of the event, we served two more families handing out eight more backpacks. Our total was 160 backpacks! Thanks be to God and to all the supporters!
