Sermon Title: When Death Will Die

Scripture text: Isaiah 25:1-12

Questions:

- 1. Think of a time you went to a great banquet, like a wedding reception. Describe the joy, excitement, fun and culinary pleasure you experienced.
- 2. What is the significance of God saying that when we are with him forever, there will be a great feast where "The mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wine, of rich food full of marrow, of aged wine well refined" (Isaiah 25:6).
- 3. This passage discusses the Death of Death and the Great Banquet of God's people, but it also talks about judgment upon Moab. In this passage Moab stands for all those who reject God. What does this tell us about God's justice?
- 4. Discuss the follow quote: "Death, the last enemy, has been conquered. But if we insist that we need no redemption, that we can take care of ourselves, God himself will assist the death angel as he carries us off." John Oswalt.
- 5. Knowing that God's great plan is to swallow up death and establish His kingdom, how does this hope influence your actions and decisions in the present?
- 6. The promised banquet is for "all peoples." How should this vision of inclusivity motivate and shape our efforts in evangelism and our relationships with people who are different from us?
- 7. What are the "fortified walls" of pride or self-reliance in your own life that you need to humble before God?
- 8. How does this passage give you both hope and motivation?
