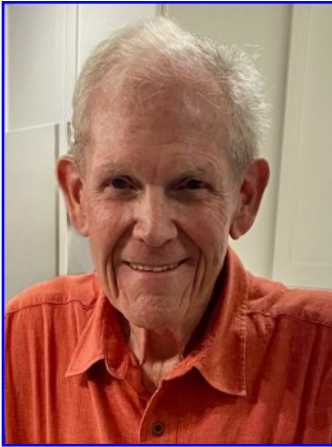

DAVID CHARLES WINSHIP, of Houston, Texas, died on July 5, 2026, at the age of 84. The son of Gladys Holcomb Winship and Robert Newton Winship Jr., David was born on April 26, 1942, in Gatesville, Texas. He married Karen Howard of Livingston, Texas on December 22, 1968, and the two shared 57 years of marriage, two children, five grandchildren, and countless friends who were charmed by his kindness and unassuming chivalry.

A proud child of The Heights, David became an All-City offensive lineman at Reagan High School where he was also the valedictorian of his senior class. He played football through college and remained a lifelong sports fan, allowing his heart to be broken repeatedly by each of the Houston sports teams, only to have it repaired again by the rugged beauty of the Texas Hill Country, the place where he found solace and fulfillment his entire life.

David took great pride in the 25 years of his career that he devoted to leading a Houston-based non-profit that helped at-risk teenagers build resilient futures through residential wilderness and educational programs. Always generous with his time and talents, he was a member of the Presbyterian Church, where he variously served as both a deacon and an elder. Above all, he loved socializing with a large group of friends and spending time with his children, grandchildren, and other family members.

David is survived by his wife, Karen Howard Winship of Houston; his daughter, Erin Winship Fry (Todd) of Houston; his son, David Jason Winship (Annie) of San Anselmo, California; and his grandchildren, Duncan and Bennett Fry and Ellie, Charlie, and Jane Winship.
