Policies and Rules

1. The leadership of all adults will be respected at all times. When leaders are speaking, giving instruction, or requesting a task to be fulfilled they need to be obeyed. By going on this trip you are agreeing to respect the leader's decisions, whether or not you personally agree with those decisions. The goal of the leaders is to have your best interest in mind at all times because we care about you. If you feel otherwise please be willing to talk with them and resolve any misunderstanding.
2. At all times you should be seeking the good of the whole group, and to respect every person you come into contact with during the missions trip.
3. We are staying at a church connected with New City Fellowship AC. Students are expected to be where they are supposed to be at the times they are supposed to be there. When we are doing stuff together, everyone is doing it together. Plan on actively participating in all group activities and being good team players.
4. A list of allergies, prescription drugs and necessary medications need to be in a Ziploc bag and handed by the parents to the leaders at the start of the trip. Parents will also need to provide clear instructions on proper use of the medication in writing.
5. No inappropriate touching, cussing, crude joking or vulgarities will be tolerated. No prolonged physical contact between anyone (ex. Laying on each other, holding hands, long side hugs)
6. Clothing should be modest/conservative. No short shorts. If any student wears immodest clothing they will be asked to change.
7. Any electronic device such as cell phones, handheld games, etc. are to only be used at designated times. You will have access to your devices on the van ride to Atlantic City. When we arrive you will be asked to turn in all your devices to a leader. Once a day, as determined by the leaders, you will have time to be on your devices to contact parents, update your social media accounts, check your stock portfolio. After that time you will return your devices to the leaders.
8. Faith Presbyterian Church and all leaders are not responsible for broken, damaged, or lost items.
9. There may be times of conflict, frustration, stress, or tears. When this happens please do not bottle it up, find comfort in other participants, or lash out. Instead, please find a leader and take time to work through the issues at hand.
10. The purpose of this trip is both spiritual and service oriented. Take care to honor that intent and not ignore or disrupt personal devotion time, small group time, worship, lesson time, or work time. Remember the purpose of this project is to glorify God and serve His people. Please come with the attitude to work and do it for the Lord.
