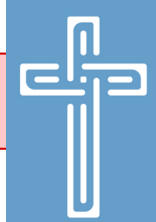

PASTOR'S PONDERING

America celebrates 250 years! As we mark this special occasion, it's important to think about the gift of freedom that we take for granted each day. Not just the freedom to do what we want, but the kind of freedom where people get to govern themselves. Our country is special and a wonderful gift.

Back in 1775, Patrick Henry stood up in front of a room full of leaders and said something that still echoes today: *"Give me liberty or give me death."* That wasn't just a catchy slogan. It was a declaration that freedom is worth everything. Henry and the other founders weren't fighting for land or riches, they were fighting for a chance to live with dignity, to make their own choices, and to answer to something higher than kings or distant governments.

What makes America stand out isn't the fact that it won a war. It's that it dared to try something new: a government *"of the people, by the people, and for the people."* Before that, most of the world was ruled by kings or empires that didn't ask ordinary folks what they wanted. America flipped the script and said, *"The people are in charge."* And they wrote it down in a Constitution that even the government had to follow. Truly radical.

But there's more: the founders knew this freedom wasn't just about laws and politics. George Washington, in his farewell speech, reminded everyone that religion and morality were the pillars holding up this whole experiment. Without a shared sense of right and wrong, without faith to guide our hearts, freedom can fall apart.

As we remember the blessings of these United States of America, it's not just about what we see. It's about something bigger: the chance to worship freely, to speak openly, to gather and dream without fear. It's about a people who believed that government exists to serve, not to rule, and that every person has worth.

As we celebrate 250 years, it's important to remember the sacrifices made, for the faith that carried us through, and that freedom is a gift that needs constant care and nurture. Washington warned us to stay united, to resist division, and to hold tight to the values that make liberty possible.

God bless America. May we keep this radical experiment burning bright, trusting not in ourselves, but in the God who has guided this great Nation from the start. And when the road gets tough, may we remember Patrick Henry's words and Washington's wisdom, that freedom is worth fighting for, worth preserving, and worth living for. Because this blessing, and this country, is more than a place. It's a call to faith, hope, and the courage to stand up for truth and justice.

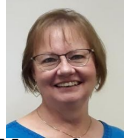

MUSICAL NOTES



Well, I'm jumping on the Happy 250th birthday, America, bandwagon.

Most of you are familiar with the hymn, "Battle Hymn of the Republic," and some of you may even recall that Julia Ward Howe is the writer of it. But, you may not know the story behind it. The information I'm giving you comes from a book I received from a friend, *Then Sings My Soul*, by Robert J. Morgan.

He writes: "In 1861, during the darkest days of the Civil War, the Howes visited Washington, and Julia toured a nearby Union Army Camp on the Potomac in Virginia. There she heard soldiers singing a tribute to John Brown, who had been hanged in 1859 for attempting to lead an insurrection of slaves at Harper's Ferry: 'John Brown's Body Lies a-mold'ring in the Grave.' The music was rousing, but the words needed improvement. Julia's pastor asked her to consider writing new and better verses. That night, after the Howes retired to their room at the Willard Hotel, the words came.

Julia said, "I went to bed and slept as usual, but awoke the next morning in the gray of the early dawn, and to my astonishment found that the wished-for lines were arranging themselves in my brain. I lay quite still until the last verse had completed itself in my thoughts, then hastily arose, saying to myself, I shall lose this if I don't write it down immediately. I searched for an old sheet of paper and an old stub of a pen which I had had the night before, and began to scrawl the lines almost without looking, as I learned to do by often scratching down verses in the darkened room when my little children were sleeping. Having completed this, I lay down again and fell asleep, but not before feeling that something of importance had happened to me."

Julia gave her song to a friend who worked at *The Atlantic Monthly*. The magazine published it in February, 1862, sending her a check for

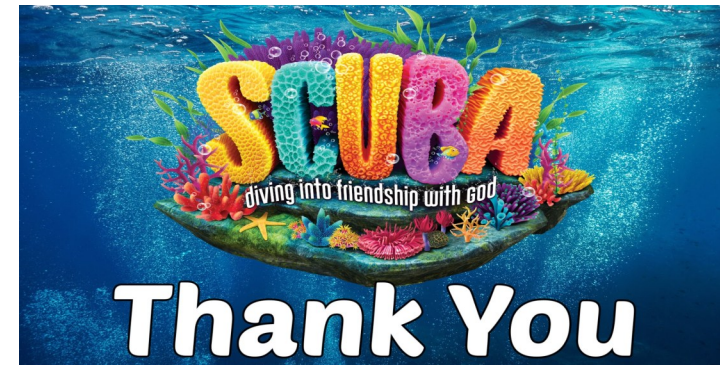

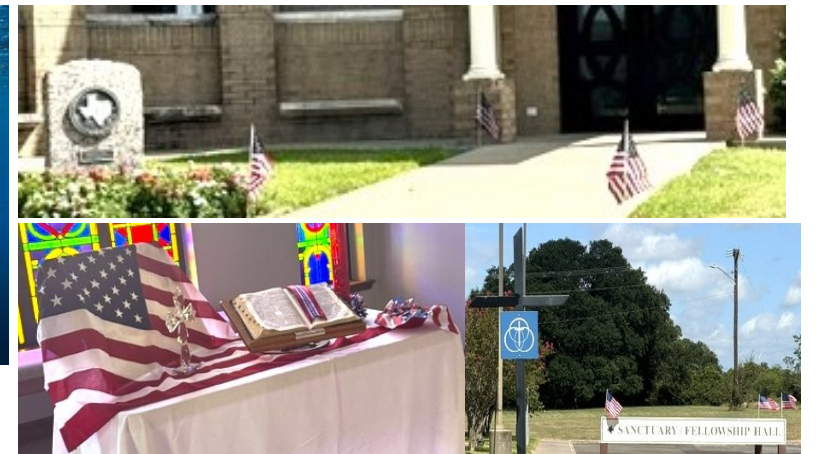
