Our Story

In 1978, several Georgetown families began hosting Bible studies in their homes. As time went by, it became clear God had something more planned. In 1979, Grace Bible Fellowship Church was formed under the guidance of another local pastor. The first Sunday service was held on January 6, 1980, at the Georgetown airport. Grace became known as the “church in the hangar,” and the pastor occasionally had to pause his message due to the noise of the airplanes.

In 1989, the time had come for the church to relocate. They held their first service at their new home on March 5. The Serenada home served GBC well for many years, but as they were blessed by continuous growth, the church eventually outgrew the limited space.

In 2014, the church moved to its present location on Shell Road. From its humble beginnings in at-home Bible groups to the prayers and verses written on the framing boards of its current location, the story of Grace Bible Church is a story of God’s guidance and faithfulness. That is the story we hope will continue to be told about GBC for years to come.

In July 2023, the Spanish Ministry became part of GBC.

Our Heart for Mission

A minimum of 12% of all contributions received by Grace Bible Church is donated to the various organizations and missionaries listed in this booklet. In addition, several people attending Grace Bible volunteer in various capacities at some of the domestic organizations, and our church, as a whole, supports individual organization fundraisers throughout the year.

We also have a prayer team that prays specifically for each of these organizations and individuals. Each year, GBC sends teams on short-term mission trips to be able to build our partnerships with our missionaries and to develop a heart for world evangelism.

What we believe

1. THE HOLY SCRIPTURES - We believe the Holy Scriptures to be the verbally inspired Word of God, authoritative, inerrant, infallible and God-breathed.

2. THE TRINITY - We believe in one Triune God, existing in three persons – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – eternal in being, identical in essence, equal in power and glory, and having the same attributes and perfections.

3. GOD, THE FATHER - We believe in God the Father, of whom are all things. God is infinite, eternal and unchangeable in His being, wisdom, holiness, justice, goodness and truth.

4. GOD THE SON, JESUS CHRIST - We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God, became man, without ceasing to be God, having been conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary, in order that He might reveal God and redeem sinful man.

We believe that He accomplished our redemption through His death on the cross as a substitutionary sacrifice. We believe that our redemption and salvation are guaranteed to us by His literal physical resurrection from the dead.

We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ is now in heaven, exalted to the right hand of God where, as His people's High Priest, He fulfills the ministry of intercession and advocacy.

5. GOD, THE HOLY SPIRIT - We believe the Holy Spirit is a person who convicts the world of sin, righteousness and judgment. In the present age, He also regenerates believers in Christ, baptizes them into the Church (the body of Christ), indwells them permanently, seals them unto the day of redemption, bestows spiritual gifts upon each one, and fills those yielded to Him.

6. THE ALIENATED CONDITION OF MAN - We believe that man was created in the image and likeness of God but that, in Adam's sin, the race fell, inherited a sinful nature, became alienated from God, and is totally unable, without God's grace, to regain its former position.

7. SALVATION - We believe that salvation is a gift of God in grace, and is received by man through personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, whose precious blood was shed for the forgiveness of our sins.

8. THE ETERNAL SECURITY OF THE BELIEVER - We believe that all true believers, once saved, are kept secure in Christ forever.

9. THE CHURCH - We believe that the Church, the body and bride of Christ, is a spiritual organism made up of all born again persons of this present age, irrespective of their affiliation with Christian organizations.

10. THE SECOND COMING OF CHRIST - We believe in the personal, imminent coming of the Lord Jesus Christ for His own, the Church, and His subsequent premillennial return to earth to set up His Kingdom.

11. THE ETERNAL STATE - We believe that the souls of those who have trusted in the Lord Jesus Christ for salvation do, at death, immediately pass into His presence, and there remain in conscious bliss until the resurrection of the body at His coming for the Church, when soul and body reunited shall be associated with Him forever in glory; but souls of unbelievers remain after death in conscious misery until the final judgment of the Great White Throne at the close of the millennium, when soul and body reunited shall be cast into the lake of fire, not to be annihilated, but to be punished with everlasting separation from the presence of the Lord and the glory of His power.

12. THE RESPONSIBILITY OF BELIEVERS - We believe that all believers should seek to walk by the Spirit, not bringing reproach upon their Lord and Savior, and that separation from sinful pleasures and practices is commanded of God.

We believe it is the obligation of every believer to demonstrate by life and testify by word to the truths of the Holy Scriptures and to seek to proclaim the gospel to all the world.

We believe that it is the responsibility of all believers to remember the work of the Lord in prayer and to support it with their means as the Lord has prospered them.

13. CHURCH ORDINANCES - We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ instituted the ordinances of baptism and the Lord's Supper to be observed by all believers until His return.

Vision

Grace Bible Church is committed to accomplishing these three New Testament purposes for the church. We seek to develop a corporate heart for God and want to be a people passionate for Him.

WORSHIP - *COME, LET US WORSHIP AND BOW DOWN*

The purpose of worship is to bring glory to God and allow people to see Him in His power and majesty. This connection will produce corporate worship times where people are free to express their hearts of adoration, praise, and thanksgiving to a God who loves them. True worship requires humbleness on the part of the worshiper and is a lifestyle rather than an event. It brings a growing intimacy with God and results in an explosion of prayer with powerful results. This connection with God will serve as a witness to a lost world that God exists and that this is a people fully enveloped in His love.

CONNECT - *YOU ARE MY DISCIPLES IF YOU LOVE ONE ANOTHER*

The purpose of fellowship is to share the life of Christ through loving relationships with other Christians. We want people who encounter us to be amazed at the love we have for one another. We believe that through our one heart and one mind, we will show the world that Christ exists and that He is a God of love. At Grace Bible, we work to establish this unity through our Connect Groups, Sunday morning School of Christian Living, and Men's and Women's Ministries.

SERVE - *LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF*

Our vision is to see every person who is part of GBC in active need-meeting ministry. We believe that God's Word calls all believers to be expressing God's love and grace to others. It is a natural expression of the life of Christ for all believers and we desire everyone to experience the joy of serving. It is our goal for people to understand their unique shape and calling for service and actively participate in sharing the love of Christ through meaningful ministry so that a lost world can see the reality of Christ and be drawn to Him.

Core Values

1. PRAYER - *Urgent and Passionate*

The goal of our prayers is to know and do the will of God. We don't want to offer Him suggestions He might think about, but rather wait upon Him to reveal His will that we may pray in agreement with Him. Christ is the Head of the church and the One who makes the decisions. The role of leaders is to know Christ, hear His voice and lead the church in surrender and obedience to His will. Prayer is the pathway to seeing that accomplished.

Romans 8:26-27 *In the same way the Spirit also helps our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words; and He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.*

2. GRACE - *New Life in Christ*

God has called us to proclaim new life in Christ and that it is available to every person. This new life is in no way connected to the old life. When a person comes to faith in Christ, repents of sin and receives God's grace, they are immediately changed. This change is an actual exchange of who they used to be for who Christ is. The life of Jesus is placed within them through His Holy Spirit and the person has a brand new identity – Jesus. We do not strive hard to be like Jesus, but we surrender to Jesus who lives His very life in us.

Galatians 2:20 *I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me.*

3. TRUTH - Growing Through His Word

God's Word gives a comprehensive view of life. It is the Creator's explanation to us about His existence, our existence and the meaning of the world and everything around us. It tells one continuous story about His redemptive plan for mankind. Studies have shown that only a very small percentage of American Christians know and live a truly Biblical Worldview. Sadly, there has been a great influence of culture on the theological development of modern American Christians. The Bible applies to all of life including the family, human sexuality, the role of government, human origins, absolute truth of right and wrong, economic systems and how we are to live in every area of life.

Colossians 2:6-8 *Therefore as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, having been firmly rooted and now being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were instructed, and overflowing with gratitude. See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deception, according to the tradition of men, according to the elementary principles of the world, rather than according to Christ.*

4. IDENTITY - Jesus Centered

It is our intention and desire to place Jesus Christ at the center of everything we do. We believe for a church to be healthy, Jesus must be exalted, lifted up and central in every ministry, age group and event. Jesus is our source for all of life both as individuals and as a community. He defines our relationships as we are His body and He is our message to the community around us. We believe everything begins and ends in Jesus.

John 15:4-5 *Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself unless it abides in the vine, so neither can you unless you abide in Me. I am the vine, you are the branches; he who abides in Me and I in him, he bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing.*

Ephesians 4:15-16 *But speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in all aspects into Him who is the head, even Christ, from whom the whole body, being fitted and held together by what every joint supplies, according to the proper working of each individual part, causes the growth of the body for the building up of itself in love.*

5. INTERGENERATIONAL - Connecting Generations

God is at work in every generation and each generation reflects the nature of God in different ways. Cultivating relationships across generational lines sometimes requires us to push through uncomfortable situations but God's Word teaches us to be intentional about breaking down any barriers that might divide us. We want everyone from the youngest to the oldest to know they are part of a community greater than their peer group. The Lord has shown us that He desires a Christian Community across generations because it is essential to following Christ; it is life-giving and it builds the church that God designed for us--one that leads to a legacy of faith that outlives us.

Acts 2:46-47 *Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.*

CHRIST

The head of the church is Christ.

ELDERS

We currently have 7 elders. The Board of Elders is the executive leadership of the church. They oversee all church operations and transactions. Each elder serves a 3-year term. You may reach them directly at elders@gbcgt.org.

- There is not a certain number added per year
- They can be voted on anytime during the year but this is typically done at the beginning of the fiscal year
- Selection for eldership shall be made by the present Board of Elders
- 3 year term, 1 year rest (Senior Pastor does not roll off – is a perpetual Elder)
- Must be men of mature Christian experience who shall meet the requirements set forth in *1 Timothy 3:1-7 and Titus 1:6-9*

STAFF

We currently have 12 total (7 Full Time & 5 Part Time)

- Selected by the Board of Elders
- Shall remain in office for indefinite period of time, or until resignation or dismissed by elders

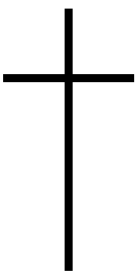

Baptism

What is baptism?

- It is an act of obedience to Jesus; He tells us to be baptized after coming to faith in Him. *Matthew 28:19*
- It is an act of worship and praise to God.
- Baptism is also a public declaration of your faith. (Baptism is not necessary for salvation, nevertheless it is a very important part of a believer’s life).
- We encourage any believer that has not been baptized to plan to do so. If you have not been baptized, we offer baptisms here at Grace Bible twice a year, in April and September.

Make Disciples

Jesus gave His church its mission at the Great Commission:

All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age.
Matthew 28:18–20

The mission of the church is to make disciples! The main verb in this passage is “make disciples” we make disciples by:

- **Going** – wherever you are and wherever you go
- **Baptizing** – this implies reaching the lost, sharing your faith
- **Teaching** – we are to teach others to observe all that He commanded us

WHAT IS A DISCIPLE?

When Jesus began calling the original disciples, He told them exactly what a disciple of His would be:

And He said to them, Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men.
Matthew 4:19,NASB95

SO A DISCIPLE IS:

- Someone who is committed to FOLLOWING Jesus
- Someone who is committed to BEING CHANGED by Jesus
- Someone who is committed to being on MISSION with Jesus

1. The head of the church is Christ. We believe that He makes His headship and leadership known through men that He chooses and equips to carry on the spiritual oversight of His work. Therefore, the spiritual leadership and administrative government of Grace Bible Church is vested in the Board of Elders.
2. All Elders must be active members of the church showing evidence of established Christian character. They shall agree with the doctrinal statement of the church and its Covenant of Fellowship. They shall be men of mature Christian experience who shall meet the requirements set forth in *1 Timothy 3:1-7* and *Titus 1:6-9*.
3. The Board of Elders is the executive board of the church and appoints all officers of the church. The board will elect a chairman from its members and may appoint other officers as necessary. The Board of Elders oversees all church operations and transactions with power to act, except that it shall not encumber the church with any loans, nor with the transfer, sale or purchase of any real estate except by authorization conveyed through a majority vote of the church membership present at a constitutionally called business meeting. The Board of Elders shall handle and consider suggestions, recommendations and grievances from, or upon the part of any member or organization affiliated with the church.

Appendix 5: *How we operate*

4. A majority of Board of Elders shall constitute a quorum for their meetings and official action shall require a two-thirds majority vote of the members present. In issues of major importance, input from the congregation will be solicited. Input from the congregation on any issue is always welcomed. However, if the question being voted concerns an application or interpretation of Scripture, a unanimous vote of the members present shall be required.

5. Selection for eldership is made by the present Board of Elders. The candidate will be presented to the church for at least two consecutive weeks for the purpose of receiving input from the congregation. Terms shall be three years. After one year's absence from the board, an elder is again eligible to be selected for additional terms, provided that each term must be followed by a period of one year's absence from the Board. The length of these terms applies only to the elder's administrative duties. Once a man has served as an elder, he will continue to be considered an elder, even though not currently serving on the Board, so that he may continue to provide spiritual leadership for the church under the authority of the serving elders. Said elder must continue his membership without interruption and maintain the standards required of elders as stated above.

1 Timothy 3:1-7 and Titus 1:6-9

Business Meetings

The church shall hold the regular annual meeting and special meetings as necessary. The date of the annual meeting is set by the Board of Elders. Special meetings may be called by the Board of Elders following any regular meeting of the church or at any other convenient time. When the business at hand requires approval of the church congregation (e.g. the buying or selling of church property) announcement of such a meeting shall be made for two Sundays prior to the date of the meeting. Every attempt will also be made to announce special meetings two Sundays in advance with an agenda available. All congregational voting will be determined by secret ballot.

No business shall be conducted without a quorum consisting of twenty-five percent (25%) of the voting membership of the church. A majority vote of the members present shall be required to transact any business.

GRACE COUNCIL

Is made up of church members who will serve as leaders to the various ministries and serve as a source of communication to the elder board. Currently with 8 members.

COORDINATORS, COMMITTEES & MINISTRY LEADERS

To enable efficient handling of Board of Elder matters, the Board may appoint various coordinators, councils and committees from within its membership, the staff and from the church at large. These coordinators, councils and committees shall perform tasks solely in accordance with the duties and with powers specifically delegated by the Board.

The general functions of coordinators, councils and committees are:

1. To plan, organize and carry out the specific areas of responsibility assigned.
2. To bring considered recommendations to the Board concerning ministries.
3. To provide a wider base of counsel to the elders having the oversight of specific ministries.

All Coordinators, Councils and Committees shall exist for the period specified by the Board of Elders.

Appendix 5: *Membership*

1. BE A CONFESSED BELIEVER IN CHRIST

Christ is the head of the church. For this reason, it is imperative that only those who acknowledge Him as Savior are part of the membership.

2. ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING ESSENTIAL DOCTRINAL TRUTHS OF SCRIPTURE

That Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God; conceived of the Holy Spirit; that His death on the cross was a substitutionary sacrifice for our sins; that He bodily arose from the dead; that salvation is a gift of God in grace and is received by means of personal faith in Christ; and that the Scriptures are the sole authority for faith and practice.

3. ATTEND STARTING POINT (WELCOME CLASS)

Welcome classes are held once a quarter and are announced in advance. Childcare is available for children during class time.

4. AGREEMENT WITH OUR VISION AND CORE VALUES

These are a composite of who we are and want to be as a church. By agreeing to the values, mission and vision, you are saying that you want to make a difference in the church and in the community for Jesus Christ. Also read and assent to the commitments enumerated in the Covenant of Fellowship (located on Page 32).

5. MEET WITH OUR PASTOR OR AN ELDER

In order for you to share how God is at work in your life and ask any questions you may have.

6. INTRODUCTION TO THE CONGREGATION

If possible, it is our preference that all new members will be introduced to the congregation during our Sunday worship services. This always proves to be a wonderful and fun experience for our entire church family.

We welcome anyone desiring to faithfully worship God, learn more about Christ, walk more in God’s ways, and serve according to the gifts He has given us to consider membership at Grace Bible Church. We know there are many wonderful churches in Georgetown, and that Grace Bible is only one of them. If you feel God encouraging you and your family to join us, then please prayerfully consider membership into our family.

Finding God’s Path ~ For me, In my life, Today

AN INTRODUCTION TO OUR S.H.A.P.E. WORKSHOP

God knew each of us before we were even formed, calling each of us by His grace to follow the path He set for us. Using two working sessions, some one-on-one discussion, available support from our Guides to help you think through your S.H.A.P.E., and our own time of reflection and prayer, this workshop will explore aspects of who God has formed you to be by helping you:

- Identify your spiritual gifts,
- Find your heart and passion for serving,
- Identify your abilities and talents that bring fulfillment,
- See how your personality guides your service, and
- Consider how God has prepared you through your life experiences

He has used all these parts of your life to bring you to where you are today. We created this workshop to help you see how He uses your Spiritual gifts, your Heart, your Abilities, your Personality, and your Experiences to position you uniquely to support His plan.

OUR S.H.A.P.E. WORKSHOP GOAL

This workshop is not about Grace Bible Church: it isn’t to make a list of people with the “right” characteristics that we can plug into the “right” slots in our ministries, although finding service opportunities in our ministries might be an outcome for you.
