Our fifth commitment is to complete the screening process and agree to follow the church policies as well as the Preschool & Children's Ministry Guide.

Our final commitment is to the children themselves. A commitment to excellence by being faithful in attendance in our classroom, on time, ready to greet our students, and prepared to teach.

temple kids commitment to parents:

To seek out qualified individuals who are committed to serving Christ by ministering to children.

To provide volunteers with training and equipping them as teachers and leaders.

To provide the facilities, materials and curriculum needed for teaching and learning.

To support each teacher in prayer and provide supervision and assistance.

safety

child check-in

When available, all children should go through Child Check-In to receive their information label.

- Mark all belongings plainly with your child's name.
- Report any special needs, allergies or instructions at check-in.
- Leave personal toys at home. They make sharing too difficult and may not be appropriate for use in teaching (a security item such as a blanket or teddy bear would be an exception). Temple Kids is not responsible for lost or damage to personal items.

dismissal policy

Children will only be released to a parent or person with the guardian label received at Child Check-in. Preschoolers will only be released to an adult; 1st-6th grade can be released to a sibling older than 6th grade. Parents should pick up children at their classrooms or designated dismissal immediately following service.



Temple Kids desires to provide a safe, clean, and healthy environment for children and our volunteers. To accomplish this, the following guidelines have been implemented to help prevent the contraction and spread of infectious diseases.

Upon the recommendation of the Committee on Control of Infectious Diseases of the American Academy of Pediatrics, a child should not be taken from the home and cannot be accepted at church functions when any of the following conditions exist:

- Fever (must be free of fever for 24 hours)
- Vomiting and/or diarrhea (must be free of vomiting and/or diarrhea for 24 hours)
- Any symptoms of childhood diseases such as Scarlet Fever, Measles, Chicken Pox, Strep Throat, Flu, etc., or any infectious contagious diseases
- Chicken Pox – all sores must be completely scabbed over and dry underneath
- Common cold – from the onset through one week
- Sore throat
- Croup
- Fifth Disease
- Any unexplained rash
- Head Lice

- Any skin infection – Boils, Ringworm, Impetigo, Thrush, Hand-Foot-Mouth disease
- Pinkeye and any other eye infections
- Cloudy or green runny nose
- Persistent cough
- Mononucleosis
- Any communicable diseases
- Children who appear ill during a session will be isolated and the parents called.

If a child does contract a childhood disease following a session in Temple Kids, the parent should inform the Children's Director.

For questionable symptoms or continuous allergies, the parents may be asked to have a form filled out by the child's physician stating that the child is not contagious before admittance is possible.

Allergies:

Parents are asked to inform us of any allergies their child(ren) may have so that the information can be entered into our database. This information will print on their Child Check-in label.

RED LIGHT

Try Again Next Week

- Fever of 101 degrees or higher
- Wheezing or shortness of breath
- Hard cough
- Constant runny nose with yellow/green tint
- Lethergy
- Diarrhea or vomiting
- Redness or runny eyes
- Sore throat or swollen glands
- Undiagnosed rashes
- Persistent itching
- Uncovered sores
- Unusual color



YELLOW LIGHT

Join us if parents can check-in a few times

- Fever-free for 24 hours
- Sporadic cough
- Minimal green/yellow runny nose



GREEN LIGHT

Okay to come in and play!

- Mild, infrequent cough
- Clear runny nose
- Active, playful, and rested

**If in doubt, please stay out
and try again next week.**

discipline

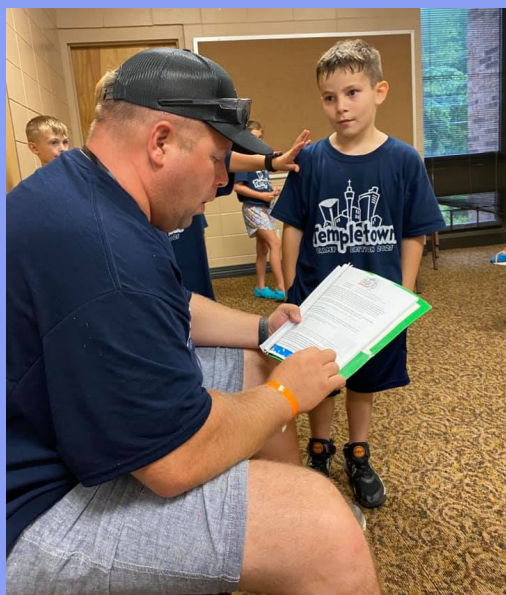
Discipline is guidance. It is to guide the child toward more acceptable behavior. Children need an extra portion of love, understanding, and an extra portion of guidance. We will be firm and fair and look for ways of counteracting trouble that may arise.

Children will be disciplined with love and appropriate instruction.

Discipline will be reasonable, developmentally appropriate considering the age of the child, and in terms the child can understand. Absolutely no physical contact of any kind will ever take place. Extended or excessive time out will not be used.

We will use praise and encouragement of good behavior rather than focusing on the negative. When necessary, we will withdraw the child from the group in a calm, matter-of-fact manner. When a timeout is necessary, it will be given in the classroom, facing the activity in the room. Time out will never occur in the hall or the corner.

If the teacher feels they have exhausted all options and the child will not comply, please notify the Children's Director. The Children's Director will notify the parents if necessary.

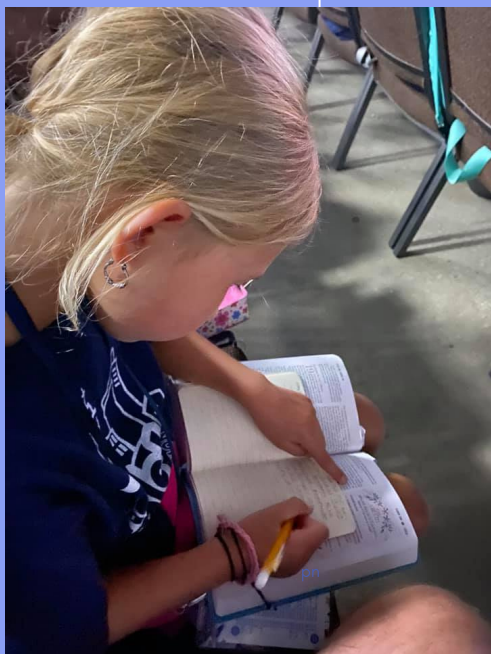


If you are willing to Admit, Believe, and Confess then the first place to start is to openly communicate that with God. We can do that through a prayer like the following:
