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DAY 1

# You Have Been Chosen

Theme: God's Sovereign Purpose

## TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

Deuteronomy 7:6 / John 15:16

*"For you are a people holy to the LORD your God. The LORD your God has chosen you out of all the peoples on the face of the earth to be his people, his treasured possession." — Deuteronomy 7:6*

## DEVOTIONAL

Before you were born, before you made a single decision, God looked across all of creation and chose you. Not because of what you had done or could do — but because of His sovereign will and His extraordinary love.

The Abrahamic covenant that anchors our text in Deuteronomy 8 wasn't the result of Abraham's application. God simply said: I choose you. And through Christ, that same divine selection extends to us. Jesus told His disciples: "You did not choose me, but I chose you."

This truth is meant to change how you see yourself. When the enemy tells you that you are nobody — remind him: I have been chosen before the foundation of the world. When you feel overlooked or forgotten — remember: I was selected by name, for a purpose, by a God who never makes mistakes.

Being chosen also comes with responsibility. God didn't choose you so you could sit still. He chose you to succeed, to overcome, and to bring Him glory in the process. Your life — your testimony, your praise, your blessing — is how an invisible God becomes visible to a watching world.

## REFLECTION QUESTIONS

**1. When is the last time you paused to thank God for choosing you?**

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**2. How does knowing you were chosen before the foundation of the world change how you approach your challenges today?**

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### 3. Who in your life needs to see God made visible through your testimony?

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#### TODAY'S PRAYER

*Lord, thank You for choosing me — not because I deserved it, but because of Your sovereign love. Help me to walk today with the confidence of someone who has been selected by the Creator of the universe. Let my life make You visible to everyone around me. Amen.*

#### TODAY'S CHALLENGE

Write down three moments in your life where God showed up in a way you didn't expect. Let those moments be your evidence that you have been chosen and are not forgotten.

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DAY 2

# God Has a Problem

*Theme: Free Will, Invisible God, Real Obstacles*

## TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

**Numbers 13:30–33 / Hebrews 11:1**

*“Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see.” —  
Hebrews 11:1*

## DEVOTIONAL

God is all-powerful. No enemy can stop Him. No circumstance is beyond His reach. And yet — He has a problem. Not with the devil. Not with your circumstances. His problem is with us.

He gave us free will. The ability to choose. And the Israelites, freed from 400 years of slavery and standing at the edge of the Promised Land, chose fear over faith. They saw the giants. They saw the fortified cities. They saw their own weakness. And they stopped.

That choice cost them 40 years. God's plan was not the wilderness — it was the Promised Land. But because they couldn't trust an invisible God while staring at a very visible enemy, they delayed the blessing. They wandered in the very provision they should have only passed through.

Here is the tension we all face: God is real, but invisible. Our problems are real, and very visible. Our bills don't disappear when we pray. The diagnosis doesn't always change overnight. The door doesn't always open on our timeline. And in those moments, every one of us is forced with the same question the Israelites faced: Do I really believe God?

The good news is this: you can delay God's plan, but you cannot cancel it. He kept His covenant with the second generation even after the first one failed. And He will keep His covenant with you.

## REFLECTION QUESTIONS

**1. What 'giants' in your life are currently making it difficult to trust God?**

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**2. Have you ever delayed a blessing by choosing fear over faith? What did that season teach you?**

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**3. How does knowing God’s plan cannot be cancelled — only delayed — change how you see your current situation?**

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**TODAY'S PRAYER**

*Father, I confess that there are moments when my problems feel more real than Your promises. Help me to see past what is visible to what is true. Give me the courage to trust You even when I cannot see the way forward. I believe You have not forgotten me. Amen.*

**TODAY'S CHALLENGE**

Identify one area where you have been operating in fear instead of faith. Write a specific declaration of trust over that situation and speak it out loud every morning this week.

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DAY 3

# God Has a Process

*Theme: Testing, Humility & The Power to Produce*

## TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

**Deuteronomy 8:16–18 / James 1:3–4**

*“But remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth, and so confirms his covenant.” — Deuteronomy 8:18*

## DEVOTIONAL

God didn't give Israel a shortcut. He gave them a wilderness. And in that wilderness, He was doing something far more valuable than making them comfortable — He was making them capable.

The testing was not punishment. It was preparation. God says He humbled them, tested them, and let them go hungry — so that they would know that man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from God. He stripped away their false sources so they could finally discover their true one.

This is God's process for you too. Some of the hardest seasons of your life are not God abandoning you — they are God preparing you. He is stripping away your dependence on stuff so you can discover your dependence on Him.

And here is the verse that changes everything: He does not give you wealth. He gives you the ability to produce it. The power is not in the paycheck — it's in you. A person who understands this can lose a job today and start over tomorrow. They can walk away from a compromising situation because they know their source is not their boss — it's their God.

You don't need the money. You need the Maker. You don't need the cash. You need the Creator. And once you truly understand that, nothing can hold you hostage — because the power to produce lives inside you.

## REFLECTION QUESTIONS

**1. What false sources have you been depending on that God may be asking you to release?**

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**2. How does the difference between 'God gives wealth' and 'God gives the power to produce wealth' change your relationship with money and work?**

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3. What is one area where God is currently testing and preparing you for something greater?

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**TODAY'S PRAYER**

*Lord, thank You for not just giving me things — but for giving me the power to produce. Forgive me for the times I've gripped stuff more tightly than I've gripped You. Help me to pass this test. Strip away whatever false source I've been trusting so that I can know — truly know — that You are my source. Amen.*

**TODAY'S CHALLENGE**

This week, practice the discipline of 'first fruits' thinking. Before you spend, before you plan, before you decide — ask God: What do You want first? Start small if needed, but start.

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DAY 4

# God Has a Plan

*Theme: Experience, Glory & Remembering the Lord*

## TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

**Deuteronomy 8:10–14 / Psalm 34:8**

*“Taste and see that the LORD is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him.” — Psalm 34:8*

## DEVOTIONAL

God's plan is not simply to give you wealth. His plan is for you to experience Him. There is a profound difference between knowing about God and knowing God — and that difference is built in the process of trusting Him through the wilderness and watching Him come through.

He doesn't just give you the answer. He walks you through the problem. Not because He's slow — but because the journey is where the testimony is built. Any employer will tell you: experience matters. And God is no different. He wants you to have a track record with Him that becomes the foundation of your faith for every future battle.

His ultimate goal is glory. He gets glory when you go through the wilderness and He provides. He gets glory when you walk out on the other side. He gets glory when you held it together — when everyone thought you would lose your mind — and you still lifted your hands in worship.

But here is Moses' warning, written specifically for the moment of blessing: Don't get so comfortable that you forget how you got there. Don't get so blessed that you stop being grateful. The Promised Land is flowing with milk and honey — but your praise should still flow just as freely.

God's plan is to bless you. His plan is to give you a testimony. His plan is to get you to the other side so that you can give Him glory — not just in the struggle, but in the success.

## REFLECTION QUESTIONS

**1. Think about a time God came through for you in a way you couldn't have engineered yourself. How has that experience shaped your faith?**

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**2. Is there an area of your life where blessing has made you forget to be grateful? How can you change that today?**

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**3. How does knowing that God gets glory in both the struggle AND the success change how you approach your current season?**

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**TODAY'S PRAYER**

*God, I want to know You — not just know about You. Thank You for the experiences that have built my faith. Help me to taste and see that You are good, even in the hard seasons. And when the blessing comes — let me never forget how I got there. You are the guest of honor at every victory in my life. Amen.*

**TODAY'S CHALLENGE**

Write out your personal 'Red Sea testimony' — a moment when God made a way where there was no way. Share it with someone this week. Your testimony is not just your story — it's your evidence.

# Trust the Invisible God

Theme: Faith, the Tithe & Living It Out

## TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

Malachi 3:10 / Proverbs 3:5–6

*“Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.” — Proverbs 3:5–6*

## DEVOTIONAL

Throughout this week, we’ve seen that God has a purpose, a problem, a process, and a plan. And all of it leads to this final truth: the only way to truly succeed is to stop trying to figure it out on your own and trust God.

God stays invisible and unpredictable for a reason. If you could see exactly how He was going to move, you would try to control Him. You’d reduce Him to a formula. And He refuses to be reduced. He is sovereign. He is God. And the only appropriate response to a sovereign, invisible God is trust.

The tithe is one of the most concrete expressions of that trust. It is the place where theology meets your bank account. It is where you say: I believe God is my source. I believe He will provide. I believe that honoring Him first — before I pay my bills, before I buy my wants — will not leave me lacking.

God actually invites us to test Him in this. Not to manipulate Him — but to give us the courage to take the first step. He says: Bring the whole tithe and see if I don’t open the floodgates of heaven. That’s not a prosperity gospel promise. That’s a covenant invitation.

You don’t need to know how God is going to come through. You just need to know that He will. If He can create a job in the middle of a global hiring freeze, He can handle whatever you’re facing today. Trust the invisible God. The door He opens, no one can shut.

## REFLECTION QUESTIONS

**1. What specific area of your life do you need to surrender to God’s plan this week?**

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**2. The tithe is described as a test of trust. What is your honest relationship with giving right now? What would it look like to truly trust God in this area?**

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**3. After five days of this devotional, what is the one thing God has spoken most clearly to you? What will you do about it?**

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**TODAY'S PRAYER**

*Lord, I choose to trust You — even when I can't see how it's going to work out. You are invisible, but You are not absent. You are unpredictable, but You are faithful. I release my grip on my plans, my provision, and my timeline. You gave me the power to produce — now I trust You to do what only You can do. Amen.*

**TODAY'S CHALLENGE**

Take the 90-Day Tithe Challenge. Commit to giving your tithe faithfully for 90 days, trusting God as your source. Text TITHE to our church text line to get connected and take the next step.

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# THE 90-DAY TITHE CHALLENGE

— Malachi 3:10

## What is the tithe?

The tithe is the first 10% of your income, given to God as an act of worship and trust. It is not a payment — it is a declaration that God is your source.

## What is the 90-Day Challenge?

For 90 days, commit to giving your full tithe faithfully — trusting God with the first fruits of your income. If God does not come through, we will refund your tithe. We are that confident in His faithfulness.

## How do I get started?

Text the word TITHE to our church text line to get connected, set up your giving, and join hundreds of others who are trusting God in this area.

## What this is NOT

This is not a prosperity gospel promise. We are not guaranteeing a yacht or a private jet. We are declaring that God is faithful to supply your need and to bless those who honor Him first.
